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MONEY INCOME IN 1973 OF FAMILIES AND PERSONS IN THE UNITED STATES

(Advance report)

According to the most recent estimates of the Bureau of the Census, part of the U.S. Department of Commerce's Social and Economics Statistics Administration, the median income of all families in the United States was \$12,050 in 1973. Of the 55.1 million families in the United States in March 1974, 19.5 million or 35.5 percent received incomes of \$15,000 or more in 1973. There were 14.1 million families (25.5 percent) with incomes between \$10,000 and \$15,000; 8.2 million families (14.9 percent) with incomes between \$7,000 and \$10,000; 5.2 million families (9.4 percent) with incomes between \$5,000 and \$7,000; and 8.0 million families (14.6 percent) with incomes below \$5,000.

The \$12,050 median income for families in 1973 represents an increase of about 8.4 percent over the 1972 median. Although most of this increase was eroded by rising prices, the net gain in real purchasing power was still significant. After adjusting for the 6.2 percent rise in prices last year, the 1973 median in terms of constant dollars increased by about 2.1 percent over the 1972 median.

The median income for both Negro and white families increased during 1973. The increase for Negro families was 5.9 percent whereas the increase for white families was 9.1 percent. The difference between these rates of growth, however, is not statistically significant. After adjusting for price changes, only the white median income showed a significant rise, increasing about 2.6 percent.

The median income of Negro families in 1973 was \$7,270 or about 58 percent of the median

income of white families of \$12,600. The 1973 ratio was not significantly different from the 59 percent for 1972, however, it does continue the downward trend in this ratio since 1970. Although the overall ratio declined between 1970 and 1973, the income ratio remained unchanged for male headed families (regardless of labor force status of wife) and the apparent increase for female headed families was not statistically significant.

The overall family income ratio of black to white is affected by several factors, and the drop reflects the influence of changes in the proportion of husband-wife families with wives in the paid labor force, the proportion of families headed by women, the number of earners in a family, occupational distribution, and work experience patterns. For example, the proportion of black husband-wife families with a working wife decreased between 1970 and 1973. Also, the percentage of black families headed by females, who generally have lower income, increased. A more complete analysis of these changes will be forthcoming in the final report.

Men and women who were income recipients in 1973 had median incomes of \$8,060 and \$2,800, respectively. The rate of increase between 1972 and 1973 in the medians was about 8 percent for both men and women.

Between 1972 and 1973 the median income for men working year round full time increased by about 8.8 percent, rising to a level of \$11,470. The median income for women working year round full time rose to \$6,490, or about 57 percent of the median for comparable men. Although this ratio is not significantly different from the 1972 value, it is about 3 percentage points lower than the 1971 ratio.

The 1973 income statistics presented in this report were obtained from the Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (CPS) of March 1974. The information was collected from the civilian noninstitutional population and members of the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post in the United States. More detailed income data for families and persons will appear in a report in this series to be issued later this year. Furthermore, another report in this series will be issued which will show detailed income data for households.

Data on income collected in the CPS are limited to money income received before payments for personal income taxes and deductions for Social Security, union dues, Medicare, etc. Money income is the sum of the amounts received from earnings; Social Security and public assistance payments; dividends, interest, and rent; unemployment and workmen's compensation; government and private employee pensions; and other periodic income. (Certain money receipts such as capital gains are not included.) Therefore,

money income does not reflect the fact that many families receive part of their income in the form of nonmoney transfers such as food stamps, health benefits, and subsidized housing; that many farm families receive nonmoney income in the form of rent-free housing and goods produced and consumed on the farm; or that nonmoney incomes are also received by some nonfarm residents which often take the form of the use of business transportation and facilities, full or partial payments by business for retirement programs, medical and educational expenses, etc. These elements should be considered when comparing income levels. Moreover, readers should be aware that for many different reasons there is a tendency in household surveys for respondents to underreport their income. Underreporting tends to be more pronounced for income sources that are not derived from earnings, such as Social Security, public assistance, and net income from interest, dividends, rentals, etc. Overall, income earned from wages or salary is much better reported than other sources of income and is nearly equal to independently derived benchmark estimates. By contrast, recent CPS income data on Social Security and public assistance payments to beneficiaries have averaged approximately 84 and 73 percent, respectively, of their benchmark estimates. For further details, see Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 90.

In the March 1974 Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census, approximately 47,000 households were eligible for interview. Of this number, 2,000 occupied units, on the average, were visited, but interviews were not obtained because the occupants were not found at home after repeated calls or were unavailable for some other reason. Since the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability. Moreover, as in all field surveys of income, the figures are subject to errors of response and nonreporting. All statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 2.0 standard error level or better. Thus, for all differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. This means that the chances are at least 19 in 20 that a difference identified in the text indicates a true difference in the population rather than the chance variations arising from the use of samples. Statements of comparison qualified in some way (e.g., by use of the phrase "some evidence") have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.
