AIAN Definitions

The Census Bureau collects race data according to U.S. Office of Management and Budget guidelines, and these data are based on self-identification. People may choose to report more than one race group. People of any race may be of any ethnic origin.

- The 1997 OMB standards permit the reporting of more than one race
- For the first time in Census 2000, individuals were presented with the option to self-identify with more than one race and this continues today.
- **American Indian or Alaska Native** – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- **Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander** – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

Where does AIAN Data come from?

Our mission is to serve as the leading source of quality data about America's people, places, and economy.

The U.S. Census Bureau is the federal government's largest statistical agency. We are assigned with:

- Developing criteria to define geographic areas
- Annually, we conduct more than 130 economic and demographic surveys each year, including :
 - The American Community Survey
 - Produce the Population & Housing Estimates
- Every five years
 - The Economic Census – the official five-year measure of American business
 - The Census of Governments – identifies the scope and nature of the nation's state and local government sector
- Every 10 years
 - The Decennial Census – the once-a-decade population and housing count of the United States






Census Economic Surveys

- Census Bureau Economic Surveys are a key source for official statistics companies can use:
 - Monthly and Quarterly are small sample surveys that provide the most **TIMELY** data available
 - Annual surveys have larger samples and provide the most up-to-date **TREND** data available
 - Every 5 years, the Economic Census measures all businesses and provides the most **COMPREHENSIVE** data available
- These surveys set the standard for U.S. economic statistics, and are fueled by the data provided by individual businesses






Geography Nesting


All Census Tracts within Lake County, Montana

Lake County nested within Montana



All Census Block Groups *nested within* Census Tracts




All Census Blocks *nested within* Block Groups



Tribal Geographies

- **Alaska Native Village Statistical Areas**
- **American Indian Joint Use Areas**
- **American Indian Reservations and Off-Reservation Trustlands** -*legally described as colonies, communities, Indian colonies, Indian communities, Indian rancheria, Indian reservations, Indian villages, pueblos, rancherias, ranches, reservations, reserves, settlements, or villages.*
- **Hawaiian Home Lands**
- **Oklahoma Tribal Statistical Areas**
- **State Designated Tribal Statistical Areas**
- **Tribal Designated Statistical Areas**
- **Tribal Subdivisions**
- **Tribal Census Tract** - *Tribal census tracts are defined independently of the standard county-based tract delineation. For federally recognized American Indian tribes with reservations or off-reservation trust land and a population less than 2,400, a single tribal census tract is defined. Qualifying areas with a population greater than 2,400 could define additional tribal census tracts within their area.*

Hierarchy of American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Areas



Flathead Tribal Reservation




Tribal Subdivisions within Flathead Tribal Reservation




Tribal Census Tract vs. Standard Tract






Tribal Census Tract & Tribal Block Group

Tribal Census Tracts within Flathead Reservation




Tribal Blocks Groups within Tribal Census Tract within Flathead Reservation







Belcourt CDP, North Dakota


ACS 5-Year 2014-2018








