

Disclosure Review Board Minutes

1. STP_363 ACLU

This was previously approved via email. The data will be rounded as all Census 2000 special tabulations. There must be at least 3 unweighted speakers of a given language who are citizens of age 18+ and in 3 different households for the data to be shown in a given geographic area. Geographic areas and/or languages may be combined to meet this threshold.

2. (b) (6) request

Only Census Bureau employees and people with Special Sworn Status can view this data, and the data must remain in a secure environment because they are identifiable.

3. Noise level indicators for economic tabular data

This may only be an issue for unweighted census data. For weighted survey data, the variance introduced by the noise could possibly be incorporated into that which is already published. (b) (6) and (b) (6) will look into this. No final decision was made. We are open to levels of noise (low, medium, and high), but we would like to see the ranges and how many cells fall into each (some examples), and are leaning toward not showing an upper limit for the high category.

4. (b) (6) request

After the meeting, (b) (6) went through all attachments and found the name of one establishment that needs to be redacted. After that is removed, the request is approved.

5. Puerto Ricans in Florida

This was approved. The data will be rounded as all Census 2000 and ACS special tabulations.

6. STP_364 (b) (6)

This was approved. These data are from Census 1990, but they will be rounded as all Census 2000 special tabulations.
