The School District Review Program: Brief Overview

- The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) contracts with the Census Bureau to conduct the SDRP in support of Title I funding
- Every two years the Census Bureau asks state mapping coordinators to update their school districts (including: boundaries, names, grade ranges, codes)
- The program is important because it determines Title I estimates for schools



Details, Materials and Dates

- Mapping coordinator principle duties:
 - Manage and obtain all updates from school districts
 - Submit those updates to the Census Bureau
- August: mailout of materials
 - Guidelines and information
 - Software and data (school district boundaries)
- December: deadline for submitting school district updates to the Census Bureau
- Early 2012: Verify boundaries online
