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
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# INTRODUCTION

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This report was prepared in accordance with the Consolidated Federal Funds Report Amendments of 1986 (P.L. 99-547), which requires "The Director of the Office of Management and Budget to prepare an annual report consolidating the available data on the geographic distribution of Federal funds..." The report reflects Federal Government expenditures by State and territory.

Coverage includes Federal Government expenditures for grants to State and local governments, salaries and wages, procurement, direct payments for individuals, and other programs for which data were available by State and territory. For fiscal year 1988, the statistics compiled amount to \$884.1 billion.

The data presented in this report on grants, salaries and wages, direct payments for individuals, procurement, and other direct Federal expenditures are shown by program or Federal agency whenever possible.

Federal Government expenditure amounts not included in this report reflect data that could not be distributed by State and territory, or that were not available. Such amounts include net interest on the Federal Government debt, international payments and foreign aid, current operational expenses not included under salaries or procurement (tables 3 and 5), expenditures for selected agencies (such as the Central Intelligence Agency and National Security Agency), and foreign outlays within each of the categories in tables 2 through 6.

## CONSOLIDATED FEDERAL FUNDS REPORT SERIES

This publication is part of the Consolidated Federal Funds Report (CFFR) series, which consists of three reports:

- Federal Expenditures by State for Fiscal Year 1988
- Consolidated Federal Funds Report, Fiscal Year 1988, Volume I, County Areas
- Consolidated Federal Funds Report, Fiscal Year 1988, Volume II, Subcounty Areas

This report presents data similar to the data in Volumes I and II of the CFFR publications. In this report, however, grants to State and local governments represent actual expenditures of the Federal Government. In the two CFFR publications, Federal grants generally represent obligations, and include payments to State and local governments as well as grants to nongovernmental recipients.

Another significant difference between this report and the CFFR publications is the level of geographic detail for which data are shown. This report distributes data only on a State-by-State basis, while the CFFR publications contain county area and subcounty area information.

The CFFR Volume I publication covers Federal expenditures for all object categories (grants, salaries and wages, direct payments for individuals, procurement, and other direct payments) shown in this publication. The CFFR Volume II publication covers only Federal expenditures for grants and procurement contract awards. Users should consult the introductory texts in the CFFR publications for detailed explanations of the data reported.

## SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF DATA

All data in this report were obtained from Federal Government departments and agencies, as outlined in the Technical Notes. Data were reviewed for accuracy and consistency, and compared to actual outlays in the Federal Budget to assure reasonableness and proper coverage. No attempts have been made to account for all Federal Government expenditures as reported in the Federal Budget, or as presented in the Census Bureau annual report *Government Finances*.

Users are urged to read carefully the Technical Notes, particularly as to the conceptual coverage represented by each table.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

Statistics for this report were gathered from a variety of sources within the Federal Government. Consequently, amounts in each table may represent different accounting or timing concepts. Below is a table-by-table description of the sources and coverage of the statistics.

Statistics representing actual expenditures of the Federal Government during the fiscal year were used whenever possible in this report. The primary exception, as noted below, was for Federal Government procurement statistics provided by the Federal Procurement Data Center. The procurement data represent the value of obligations for contracts awarded during the fiscal year.

### Table 1

All amounts in table 1 were carried forward from succeeding tables. Data were rounded to millions of dollars.

Table 2

All amounts on Federal Government grants to State and local governments represent actual cash outlays or payments made during the fiscal year. Each Federal Government executive department and agency provides annual data on grants to governmental units pursuant to OMB Circular A-11, and the Consolidated Federal Funds Report. The data are collected from Federal agencies by the Census Bureau.

Prior to 1983, such data were incorporated into the report *Federal Aid to States*, published by the Department of the Treasury, Fiscal Service—Bureau of Governmental Financial Operations, Division of Government Accounts and Reports. The Treasury Department collection and publication of Federal grants was done in accordance with the former Treasury Circular 1014 and the annual Treasury Financial Manual. Both of these contained definitions and reporting guidelines that were consistent with OMB Circular A-11 and the current Census Bureau reporting guidelines. Hence this publication (*Federal Expenditures by State*) and the previous Treasury publication *Federal Aid to States* provide users with historically consistent statistics on Federal agency grants to State and local governments.

Federal Government aid to State and local governments includes the following:

1. Direct cash grants to State or local government units.
2. Payments for grants-in-kind, such as purchases of commodities distributed to State or local government institutions (e.g., school lunch programs).
3. Payments to nongovernmental entities when such payments result in cash or in-kind services passed on to State or local governments.
4. Payments to regional commissions and organizations that are redistributed at the State or local level.
5. Federal Government payments to State and local governments for research and development that is an integral part of the provision of public services.
6. Shared revenues.

It should be noted that the concept of grants covered in table 2 excludes Federal Government payments to individuals, profit or nonprofit institutions not covered above, and payments for services rendered. Grants to individuals and profit or nonprofit institutions are covered in table 6 of this report. Payments for services rendered are largely covered in table 5 of this report.

The examination and edit process used by the Census Bureau included comparison of reported data to that submitted for the prior year, and to budget amounts supplied by the Office of Management and Budget. All grants data were reconciled by budget account and to

budget figures that each Federal agency is required to submit annually to OMB, in accordance with OMB Circular A-11. Discrepancies were brought to the attention of the submitting agencies and, where warranted, revisions were made. The Office of Management and Budget also provided assistance in the classification of grants and in ensuring compliance with the reporting requirements.

For one grant program shown in table 2, the State-by-State allocation of outlays was estimated. State totals for the Compensatory Education for the Disadvantaged were calculated by applying the pro rata share of each State's award allocation to the United States total outlay for this program. The State award allocations were obtained from the Department of Education.

Table 3

Amounts reported for Federal Government salaries and wages were taken from statistics provided by the Department of Defense, Department of Transportation (United States Coast Guard), Federal Bureau of Investigation, Office of Personnel Management, and United States Postal Service. All amounts represent outlays during the Federal Government fiscal year indicated.

Department of Defense military payroll statistics were provided by the Directorate for Information, Operations and Reports, Washington Headquarters Services, Department of Defense. Amounts represent estimates by State, and include gross compensation, except retired military pay which is reported in table 4. Other features of the Department of Defense salaries and wages data include:

1. Amounts for military personnel stationed overseas are excluded from totals.
2. Salaries and wages for inactive personnel refer to military reserve and National Guard payroll.
3. Amounts reported reflect the State and territory of employment (duty station) rather than home residence.

Payroll statistics provided by the United States Postal Service represent actual outlays during the fiscal year, but with the national total distributed among the States on an estimated basis. State-by-State estimates were derived by calculating the "per employee" payroll cost, applying this cost to each postal facility based upon the number of employees, then aggregating to the State level for reporting purposes. Estimates were based on place of employment rather than place of residence.

Salaries and wages for employees of the Federal Bureau of Investigation were obtained separately from that agency. Prior to 1986, these amounts were included in data for civilian agencies provided by the Office of Personnel Management.

Salaries and wages for uniformed employees of the U.S. Coast Guard were provided by that agency. Geographic allocation were based upon place of employment.

Statistics on salaries and wages (including premium pay and lump sum payments) for all other civilian Federal Government personnel working in the States and territories were obtained from the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). The OPM statistics reflect actual outlays during the fiscal year for civilian salaries, but with the national aggregate distributed among the States on an estimated basis. Assumptions of the salaries and wages data compilation from OPM were:

1. The basis for the geographic distribution was place of employment. Data on salary and employment distribution from the Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) Central Personnel Data File (CPDF) as of March 31st of the fiscal year were used to geographically pro-rate to total fiscal year payroll and payment data from the SF 113-A, "Monthly Report of Federal Civilian Employment."
2. Estimated payroll data were produced at the State, county, and territory levels only.
3. DOD and Non-DOD State, county, and territory payroll data were partially estimated, predicated on the assumption that premium pay and lump sum payments as well as part-time and intermittent pay were proportional to the salaries of full-time Federal civilian employees (defense and non defense) in the counties and territories.
4. Judicial pay was estimated based on the above assumption with the exception of the Supreme Court whose SF 113-A pay was added to the District of Columbia's non-defense payroll.

The methodology used to estimate the geographic breakdown involved the following steps:

1. Actual expenditures for salaries and wages were obtained from the SF 113-A. Salary and wage data on the SF 113-A were total expenditures (including basic, premium, and lump sum payments) for all Federal civilian employees. These data were not reported by State and county on the SF 113-A.
2. From OPM's CPDF and agency survey data (Tennessee Valley Authority) aggregate basic salaries for full-time employees only were computed for each U.S. county, each U.S. Territory, total U.S., and total U.S. Territories. Based on these aggregate basic salaries, DOD and non-DOD percentages were computed. These percentages determined each county's and territory's proportion of the total (U.S. and U.S. Territories) full-time salaries.
3. The percentage referenced above for DOD and non-DOD were applied to SF 113-A DOD and non-DOD payroll data for the U.S. and U.S. Territories to estimate actual expenditures in U.S. counties and U.S. Territories. State and U.S. Territory totals were obtained by aggregating estimated actual expenditures in U.S. counties and U.S. Territorial, respectively.

4. The District of Columbia's estimated actual expenditures were computed by the above methodology. However, a supplement was then added to this estimate for agencies not reporting to the Central Personnel Data File. The supplement consisted of agency payroll data for the following agencies: U.S. Congress, Congressional Budget Office, White House Office, Office of the President, Federal Reserve Board, Architect of the Capitol, U.S. Botanic Gardens, Library of Congress, Copyright Royalty Tribunal, U.S. Tax Court, Office of Technology Assessment, and the Supreme Court. Since employment in these agencies is primarily, and most cases totally, in the District, payroll data were added to the District's estimate.

The Office of Personnel Management, Workforce Analysis and Statistics Division, can be contacted for additional information.

Table 4

Except where indicated, data in table 4 were compiled from amounts reported by the Federal agencies for the Federal Assistance Award Data System.<sup>1</sup> Amounts reported represent obligations of Federal funds.

Data on Social Security, Medicare, and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments were obtained from reports submitted by the Department of Health and Human Services for the Federal Assistance Award Data System. All amounts reflect obligations during the fiscal year, with the State-by-State distribution estimated. All amounts are reported by recipient location. Excluded from the amounts reported are payments to recipients in foreign countries. The amounts shown under the SSI program exclude any State government shares administered by the Federal Government.

Retirement and disability payments for Federal civilian and military personnel represent actual expenditures during the fiscal year. Data on military retirement were obtained along with Department of Defense salaries data (see Technical Notes for table 3 above).

Data on retired civilian payments were received from the Office of Personnel Management, Compensation Group. Figures include expenditures for all periodic annuity, survivor annuity, lump sum death claims, and withdrawals. Annual expenditures reflect actual payments, with the State-by-State distribution based on the ZIP code of the recipient's place of residence. Included in the amounts shown for civilian retirement benefits is \$333.7 million in benefits for retired uniformed Coast Guard personnel, for

<sup>1</sup>The Federal Assistance Award Data System (FAADS) is a quarterly report of financial assistance awards made by each Federal agency. Coverage includes grants, direct payments to individuals, insurance, and loans. Data submitted by Federal agencies for this survey serve as the source, as indicated, for many of the statistics in this publication. The Office of Management and Budget selected the Census Bureau as executive agent, responsible for operating FAADS.

which data were obtained from the Department of Transportation. Also included in the total is \$70.3 million in benefit payments for retired Public Health Service Commissioned Corps employees, obtained from that agency. Also included are benefits and lump sum withdrawals for three smaller Federal employee programs: Foreign Services Officers (\$250.4 million); the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Corps (\$4.9 million); and Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) (\$94 million). Data were obtained from the State Department, NOAA, and TVA respectively.

Amounts reported for the various veterans programs in table 4 were obtained from data supplied by Veterans Administration (VA) for the Federal Assistance Award Data System (FAADS). Information from each quarterly FAADS report covering fiscal year 1988 was tallied to arrive at the fiscal year totals. Amounts reported by the VA for veterans benefit programs represent actual outlays during the year. Foreign payments are excluded from the data.

Food stamp program information was obtained from data supplied by the Department of Agriculture for the Federal Assistance Award Data System. Amounts reflect the actual value of coupons issued, by State, during the fiscal year. Figures may differ slightly from amounts representing the value of coupons redeemed or processed through the Federal Reserve System.

Social insurance payments for railroad workers reflect benefits paid under the Railroad Retirement and Railroad Unemployment Insurance Acts. Amounts represent actual outlays during the fiscal year, reported by residence of recipient. Data were reported by the Railroad Retirement Board, Research and Analysis Bureau for the Federal Assistance Award Data System.

Amounts for the Housing Assistance payments were provided by the Department of Housing and Urban Development in a special submission for the Federal Assistance Award Data System. Data on the Pell grant program represent actual outlays during the fiscal year. The State-by-State distribution was based on the location of the recipient school to which the payment was made.

The National Guaranteed Student Loan program amounts represent interest subsidies paid to lending institutions during the fiscal year. Total Federal expenditures reflect actual payments. Information on this program was supplied by the Department of Education in a special submission for the Federal Assistance Award Data System.

Earned income tax credits represent Federal Government refunds during calendar year 1988. Information was obtained from the Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service, Statistics of Income Division. Amounts reflect only the excess earned income tax credit portion—that amount actually refunded.

Federal Employee Workers Compensation payments were obtained from reports submitted by the Department of Labor, Employment Standards Administration, Office of Workers' Compensation Programs, for the Federal Assistance Award Data System. Amounts for fiscal year 1988

reflect actual payments, with the State-by-State distribution based on the ZIP code of the recipient's place of residence.

Federal Government expenditures for Black Lung benefits are reflected in two programs. Coal Mine Workers Compensation payments refer to the program administered by the Labor Department, Employment Standards Administration. The program is number 17.307 in the *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance* (CFDA). Amounts reported for this program represent actual outlays during fiscal year 1988. Amounts for Special Benefits for Disabled Coal Miners reflect CFDA program 13.806, of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Amounts reflect obligations for the fiscal year, distributed on the basis of residence of the recipient.

Statistics on Federal expenditures for unemployment compensation were compiled from information obtained from the Department of Labor. Amounts reported include: Federal reimbursements to States for unemployment benefits paid to ex-Federal employees; the Federal Government share of extended unemployment benefits; and Federal Government advances of State government amounts. Negative entries are possible, reflecting repayments by State governments of amounts previously advanced by the Federal Government. It should be noted that the amounts shown for unemployment compensation do not include any benefits paid or funded by State Governments or State payroll taxes.

Of the amount shown in the "other" direct payments column, two data items were obtained from sources other than FAADS. These were payments under the Pension Plan Termination Insurance program of the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation and the Safety Officers Benefit program of the Justice Department.

Table 5

Statistics in table 5, covering Federal Government procurement contracts, were obtained from the United States Postal Service (USPS) and the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC).

Amounts provided by the USPS represent actual outlays for contractual commitments, while amounts provided by the FPDC represent the value of obligations for contract actions, and do not reflect actual Federal Government expenditures. In general, only current year contract actions are reported for data provided by the FPDC; however, multiple-year obligations may be reflected for contract actions of less than 3 years duration.

The FPDC collects procurement statistics on a quarterly basis from most Federal Government departments and agencies, and provides these data according to the place of performance rather than the location of the prime contractor. Excluded from the procurement totals reported are amounts for the judicial and legislative branches of government and most intergovernmental transfers of funds. Also excluded from the totals are amounts for procurement in foreign countries. As indicated in the footnotes to

table 5, foreign procurement awards were \$9.6 billion in fiscal year 1988, with \$8.2 billion for the Defense Department and \$1.4 billion for all other Federal Government agencies other than the USPS.

Most contract actions provided by the FPDC with values under \$25,000 were not distributed by State and territory. These amounts, as indicated in the footnotes to table 5, were reported as "undistributed."

Procurement data provided by the USPS include all outlays made under formal contractual agreements. The FPDC data include contractual actions for construction, purchase of equipment, and other purchases of tangible items by the Federal Government. Also included with the FPDC data are contractual actions for services often not generally associated with procurement, such as the purchase of utilities, building leases, and other services entered into via contractual agreement.

#### Table 6

Grant amounts shown in table 6 were obtained from the Federal Assistance Award Data System. It should be noted that these grant programs represent awards to nongovernmental recipients during the fiscal year. The amounts do not duplicate data on grant expenditures reported in table 2. Appendix C contains a list of the specific grant programs included in table 6.

Table 6 grant amounts generally represent obligations of the Federal Government, based upon awards of financial assistance during the fiscal year. Estimates of the differences between these amounts and actual expenditures are not available, but are believed to be small and based upon timing considerations.

Amounts shown for "direct payments—other than for individuals" were obtained from the Federal Assistance Award Data System, with exceptions for those programs listed below. These amounts generally represent obligations incurred during the fiscal year.

The Agriculture Department was the source for data on claims and adjustor expenses under the Federal Crop Insurance program. Data reflect actual expenditures during the fiscal year.

Amounts shown for the Federal employee life and health insurance programs were obtained from the Office of Personnel Management. For both the life insurance and health insurance programs, the amounts reported represent only employer (Federal Government) share of the premiums. The life insurance portion of premiums (\$332 million) was allocated by State according to the percentage of the total of all death and dismemberment claims paid to each State or territory. The employer share for health insurance premiums (\$5,930 million) was allocated based upon calendar year 1988 claims filed at the local carriers headquarters offices in each State area.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency provided data on claims paid under the National Flood Insurance Program. Amounts for other Postal Service expenditures and expenditures of the Legal Services Corporation were

obtained from these two agencies, respectively. The Legal Services Corporation payments represent annualized grants and contracts, by State, made by this agency from the subsidy it receives from the Federal Government.

#### Table 7

Amounts in table 7 do not represent actual expenditures of the Federal Government, but instead reflect the volume of loan or insurance activities. These amounts represent either direct loans made to certain categories of borrowers, or the Federal Government contingent liability for loans guaranteed and direct insurance against loss. All amounts reflect the dollar value of loans or insurance coverage provided during the fiscal year, and not the cumulative totals of such activity over the life of the programs.

Data were obtained from quarterly reports submitted to the Bureau of the Census for the Federal Assistance Award Data System by the departments and agencies which administer the programs shown.

#### Table 8

Per capita amounts in table 8 were computed using 1988 population estimates for the 50 States and the District of Columbia, and 1987 population estimates for the territories. All computations were based on dollar amounts in thousands.

#### Table 9

Percentage distributions were computed based on dollar amounts in thousands.

#### Table 10

All amounts in table 10 were computed from data in tables 2 through 6. Figures for Department of Defense grants to State and local governments (table 2), salaries and wages (table 3), retired military pay (table 4), procurement (table 5), and research grants (table 6) were tallied to arrive at a total for Department of Defense expenditures.

This total was then netted from the grand total of Federal Government expenditure, and the residual categorized as nondefense expenditures. This procedure was followed for each State and territory.

Per capita and percent distribution amounts were computed using the derived defense/nondefense totals, as described above for tables 8 and 9.

Data in the column on Energy Department defense related activities were obtained from the Department of Energy, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Defense programs. These data represent atomic energy defense activities, and are presented on an exhibit basis only. Dollar amounts represented are included under other categories (such as procurement or salaries and wages) in tables 2-6.

Table 11

*Federal Expenditures by State* has been published annually since fiscal year 1981. The data in table 11 represent summary totals, by State and object category, of covered Federal expenditures from fiscal years 1981 to 1988. Amounts shown include revisions to originally published figures, where applicable. These revisions were made where errors existed in the original data, or where Federal programs have been reclassified to another object category of expenditure.

Users should be aware of the several factors that affect the historical consistency of the data:

- Data on Federal Government share of Federal employee life and health insurance programs were not included prior to fiscal year 1983.
- Prior to the 1986 fiscal year, data for two functions were not included in the publications: Salaries and wages for uniformed employees of the United States Coast Guard; Retirement benefit payments for the Public Health Service Commissioned Corps retirement system.

- Effective with the fiscal year 1988 publication, some of the data from the early years (1981-84) were revised due to corrected rounding procedures. These are not individually identified, since the changes generally amounted to one digit.

Table 12

Rankings in table 12 were derived from expenditures for object categories reported in tables 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. All rankings were based upon per capita amounts. The District of Columbia and the U.S. Territories were excluded from the computations.


