PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES: MARCH 1, 1950

The total population residing in continental United States was about 150,588,000 on March 1, 1950, according to estimates released today by Roy V. Peel, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. The population of the United States including armed forces overseas and the civilian population on March 1, 1950, are estimated at 150,998,000 and 149,653,000, respectively.

These estimates are not based upon advance information from the Seventeenth Decennial Census, which is being conducted as of April 1, 1950. These estimates as well as the other estimates presented in this report are based on the 1940 census; statistics of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; sta-

tistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures on births and deaths have been adjusted for incomplete registration.

It is estimated that between 150½ and 151 million persons will be counted as of April 1, 1950, in the official census of the total population residing in continental United States now being conducted.

Comparable estimates for each month in 1947 and 1948 are available in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 27.

The absolute figures presented in this release have been rounded to the nearest thousand. Derived figures are based on the unrounded numbers.
