### PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES: MAY 1, 1950

Because of the need for a series showing changes in the total population of the United States, the Bureau of the Census is continuing its series of provisional monthly estimates even though figures from the 1950 Census will become available shortly. The level of the series will be revised later to bring it into line with the results of the 1950 Census, but it is expected that the general trends and month-to-month changes will not be affected greatly by this adjustment.

The estimates shown below are not based upon advance information from the Seventeenth Decennial Census, which was conducted as of April 1, 1950. The estimates presented in this report,

including the one for April 1, 1950, are based on the 1940 Census; statistics of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures on births and deaths have been adjusted for incomplete registration.

Comparable estimates for each month in 1947 and 1948 are provided in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 27.

The absolute figures presented in this release have been rounded to the nearest thousand.
