PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES JULY 1, 1950

The series of provisional monthly estimates of the population is being continued without adjustment to the preliminary April 1 census total announced on July 22, 1950. The decision to continue this series for the present without adjustment was reached because of the extremely close agreement between the provisional estimate and the preliminary total, and because of the fact that the preliminary total is still subject to revision. It is noteworthy that the population estimate for April 1 shown in the table below (150,778,000) is less than 0.2 percent above the preliminary census figure of 150,500,000. When the final 1950 Census count becomes available, the level of this series will be revised to bring it into line with that figure, but it is expected that the general trends and month-to-month changes will not be affected greatly by this adjustment.

The estimates presented in this report, including the one for April 1, 1950, are based on the 1940 Census; statistics of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures on births and deaths have been adjusted for incomplete registration.

Comparable estimates for each month in 1947 and 1948 are provided in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 27.

The absolute figures presented in this release have been rounded to the nearest thousand.
