PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES APRIL 1, 1950, TO MARCH 1, 1951

The total population of the United States, including armed forces overseas, was about 153,490,000, as of March 1, 1951, according to estimates released today by Roy V. Peel, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. This figure represents an increase of 2,357,000, or 1.6 percent, over the corresponding figure for April 1, 1950. Estimates for the first of each month, April 1950 to March 1951, are as follows:

The estimates presented in this report are based on the final count from the 1950 Census; statistics and estimates of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures on births and deaths have been adjusted for incomplete registration. Corresponding estimates for July 1 and January 1 dates in the 1940-50 decade, consistent with the above estimates, have been published in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 48.
