## POPULATION ESTIMATES

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### PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF REGIONS, DIVISIONS, AND STATES: JULY 1, 1950

Provisional estimates of the population of regions, divisions, and States for July 1, 1950, were released today by Roy V. Peel, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. These estimates are comparable with estimates for July 1 of each year, 1940 to 1949, available in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 47, and July 1 of each year, 1910 to 1939, available in Population--Special Reports, Series P-45, No. 9.

The population estimates shown in the present report are based upon the 1950 Census and statistics and estimates of births, deaths, immigration, emigration, net internal migration, and the strength and geographic distribution of the armed forces. In view of the inadequacy of some of the information on which these estimates are based, it is quite possible that they may differ somewhat from revised estimates which will be prepared for publication by the Bureau of the Census when additional postcensal data and more detailed data from the 1950 Census become available. The estimates of population change between April 1, 1950, and July 1, 1950, shown in this report are of considerably less reliability than the population estimates themselves, and small changes should be used with particular care. It is especially important to note that these estimates of population change are not reliable enough for use in developing estimates of net migration for States during the 3-month period following the census.

The estimated civilian population of each State was prepared by adding to the civilian population on April 1, 1950, an estimate of births, adding or subtracting an estimate of net civilian migration, and subtracting an estimate of civilian deaths and an estimate of the net loss of civilian population to the armed forces for the 3-month period between the census and estimate date. The estimated total population of each State was derived by adding to the estimated civilian population an estimate

of the armed forces stationed in each State. The State estimates of total and civilian population were finally adjusted to add to the independent national totals for July 1, 1950, already published in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 46.

The birth and death statistics used in preparing these estimates were provisional figures classified on an occurrence basis. They were first adjusted to represent births and deaths on a residence basis and then corrected for underregistration. The adjustment of the death statistics for underregistration was confined to deaths of infants under one year of age.

The estimates of net civilian migration for each State were obtained by extrapolation of the annual migration series implied in the provisional intercensal estimates of the population of States for 1940 to 1949, shown in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 47. The estimated net loss of civilian population to the armed forces for each State represents the difference between the number of persons from the State serving in the armed forces on July 1, 1950, and the number in the armed forces on April 1, 1950, plus an allowance for persons from the State who died during this period while serving in the armed forces.

The vital statistics were provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; the statistics on immigration and emigration were obtained from the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and the figures relating to the armed forces were provided by the Department of Defense.

The estimates presented in this report have been independently rounded to the nearest thousand from figures computed to the last digit; hence, the sums of parts shown may differ slightly from the totals shown. Percentages are based on the unrounded numbers.
