PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES APRIL 1, 1950, TO MAY 1, 1952

The total population of the United States, including armed forces overseas, was about 156,602,000, as of May 1, 1952, according to estimates released today by Roy V. Peel, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. This figure represents an increase of 5,469,000, or 3.6 percent, over the corresponding estimate for April 1, 1950. Estimates for April 1 and July 1, 1950, and for the first of each month, January 1951 to May 1952, are as follows:

The estimates presented in this report are based on the total population count from the 1950 Census; statistics and estimates of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures for births and deaths to January 1, 1952, have been adjusted for incomplete registration on the basis of an extension of the results of the test for completeness of birth registration conducted by the National Office of Vital Statistics in 1940. The figures for births and deaths after January 1, 1952, have been adjusted on the basis of the test conducted in 1950. As a consequence, the monthly change implied in the population estimates for dates after January 1, 1952, is about 6,000 lower than it would be had births corrected on the basis of the 1940 test been used. Revised estimates, taking into account the results of the 1950 test for completeness of birth registration, will be prepared and published in the near future.

Estimates for July 1 and January 1 dates in the 1940-50 decade, consistent with the above estimates, have been published in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 48.
