### PROVISIONAL ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES JANUARY 1, 1950, TO JULY 1, 1953

(Comparable estimates for each month, from May 1, 1950, to December 1, 1951, are given in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 65)

The total population of the United States including armed forces overseas, was about 159,696,000 on July 1, 1953, according to estimates released today by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. This figure represents an increase of 8,564,000 or 5.7 percent, since April 1, 1950, the date of the last census, and an increase of 2,715,000 or 1.7 percent, over the estimate for the corresponding month a year ago. Estimates for selected months back to Jan. 1, 1950, are as follows:

The estimates presented in this report are based on the total population count from the 1950 Census; statistics and estimates of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on immigration and emigration provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice; and data on the armed forces provided by the Department of Defense. The figures on births and deaths have been adjusted for incomplete registration.
