## POPULATION ESTIMATES

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### ESTIMATES OF THE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES, BY AGE, COLOR, AND SEX JULY 1, 1957 TO 1959

(This report presents provisional estimates for July 1, 1959, and revised estimates for July 1, 1958. The estimates for 1959 include Alaska but exclude Hawaii, and those for 1958 and 1957 exclude both Alaska and Hawaii, in accordance with the status of these areas on the estimate date. The estimates for 1958 and 1957 supersede the corresponding figures published in Series P-25, No. 193. Estimates for July 1 of each year, 1900 to 1956, comparable to those shown here, are given in Nos. 98, 114, 146, 170, and 193 of this series)

There were about 1 $\frac{1}{4}$  million more children of elementary school age and nearly 400,000 more children of high school age in our population in mid-1959 than there were a year earlier, according to estimates of the population of the United States, by age, color, and sex, just completed by the Bureau of the Census and shown in this report. Other significant changes in the population during that year were relatively large increases in the number of youths

of college age and in the number of aged persons, a continuation of the decline in the median age of the population (now at 29.3 years) and in the proportion of males, and a decline in the number of young adults between the ages of 25 and 35. During the year, about 3.8 million children became old enough to enter school for the first time (reached age 6), 1.2 million males reached age 18, and about 2.3 million persons reached their majority (age 21).

This report presents estimates of the population of the United States by age, color, and sex, for July 1, 1957, 1958, and 1959 for (1) the population of the United States including Armed Forces abroad, (2) the population residing in the United States, and (3) the civilian population. The figures for July 1, 1959, include Alaska, which officially became a State on January 3, 1959. The addition of Alaska has only a small effect on the changes under discussion.

#### INDICATED CHANGES

Age composition.--Between April 1, 1950, the date of the last census, and July 1, 1959, the total population of the United States including Armed Forces abroad increased almost 26 million, or 17.2 percent. Primarily because of past fluctuations in the annual number of births, however, the growth rates for some of the age groups were quite different from the average for all ages (table A). Children of elementary school age (5 to 13 years) showed the most rapid gains, increasing by more than 10 million, or 46 percent, during this period. There were 32,388,000 children in this age group on July 1, 1959, compared with 22,180,000 on April 1, 1950. In 1945, at the end of World War II, there were only about 19½ million children in this age range. This group will continue to grow for at least several years to come. Children of preschool age (under 5 years) now number about 19.8 million, or 3.6 million more than in 1950. Most of these children will be entering school during the next five years; by 1960, close to 4 million children a year will become old enough to enter school for the first time.

Youths of high school age (14 to 17 years) reached a record high number of 10,990,000 in 1959, as the 1944-45 "war babies" entered the age group, replacing the smaller number born during 1940-41. This age group has increased annually since 1950, when it numbered 8.4 million, the lowest level since 1925. Since the beginning of this decade, the group has increased by about 2.6 million, or 30.7 percent. In 1956-57 alone more than 600,000 persons were added to the population of high school age. In the year 1958-59, the increase amounted to about 360,000. It is anticipated that the high-school age group will continue to grow at a relatively rapid pace in the next several years because of the general increase in the annual number of births during the war and early postwar years.

The downward trend in the size of the college-age population (18 to 21 years), characteristic of the middle and late 1940's and early 1950's, has come to an end, and small annual gains have occurred since 1954. There were 9.3 million persons in this group in 1959. Although it is now larger than at the beginning of this decade, it is still below its World War II peak, when the group numbered 9.7 million. The college-age group is expected to show a small increase in the next year. After 1960, this group will begin to grow more rapidly, as the larger number of persons born during the war and early postwar years replaces the smaller number born in the latter part of the 1930's and the first part of the 1940's, respectively.

The number of persons in the principal working ages (18 to 64 years) has increased by 6.4 million since the beginning of this decade. There were 98½ million persons in this group on July 1, 1959, compared with 92.2 million in 1950. The rate of growth of this age group--about 6.9 percent--was substantially below the rate of growth of the total population, however. Most of the increase occurred among those 45 years of age and over. The number of persons 45 to 64 years of age increased by 5.1 million, or 16.7 percent, whereas those 18 to 44 increased by 1.2 million, or only 2.0 percent. In the next decade, the 18-to-44-year group is expected to grow much more rapidly.

The population 65 years and over continued to show rapid gains, having increased about 3.2 million since 1950, or by roughly 26.1 percent. There were 15.4 million persons 65 years and over in July 1959, compared with 12.2 million in 1950, and fewer than 9 million in 1940. During the 1950's, this group has been increasing by about 350,000 each year. In 1959, about 1 in every 12 persons in our population was 65 years old or older as compared with 1 in every 15 in 1940.

These relatively rapid rates of growth in the younger and older age groups compared with those in the middle groups have brought about a substantial increase in the ratio of the number of persons in the "dependent" ages (under 18 years and 65 years and over) to the number in the "productive" ages (18 to 64 years). Thus, in 1945 at the end of World War II, there were 59 persons in the "dependent" ages for every 100 persons of working age. By 1959, this ratio had increased to 80 persons in the dependent ages for every

100 persons of working age. These changes in age composition have directly affected the ratio of dependent persons (nonworkers) to productive persons (labor force including Armed Forces) during the postwar period, although changes in worker rates have also been important.

Changes in the percent distribution by age of our population since 1900 are given in figure 1.

The median age of the population stood at 29.3 years on July 1, 1959. This figure represents a decline from the 30.2 years shown for 1950. The median age was 29.0 years in 1940 and 22.9 years in 1900. The median age had increased during each intercensal period as far back as 1800. However, primarily as a result of the continued high level of the birth rate since the end of World War II, the median age has declined slightly in recent years. Table B shows the median age at each census date since 1900 and for July 1, 1959.



Other important changes in the population during recent periods are the shifts in the annual number of persons reaching certain "key" ages.

Between 1950 and 1959, approximately 2.2 million youths reached age 18 annually. The number rose slightly from 2.1 million in 1950-51 to 2.4 million in 1958-59; the latter figure is about the same as the 1930-50 average. The annual number becoming age 18 each year is expected to increase in future years as persons born during the 1940's reach this age.

There have been significant increases since the 1930's in the number of persons reaching the age of eligibility for Social Security benefits. The annual number of persons reaching age 65 has increased steadily from an average of 758,000 in the 1930-40 decade (when the Social Security laws were enacted) to 1,284,000 in 1958-59. Thus, there was an increase of more than one-half million, or nearly 70 percent, in the number reaching age 65 annually. Under recent

changes in the law, the eligibility age of women has been reduced to 62 years. More than 700,000 women reached age 62 during each of the past four years. On the average, 692,000 women reached this age annually since 1950, compared with 550,000 during the 1940's and 429,000 during the 1930's. Estimates of the number of persons reaching various key ages each year between 1950 and 1959 and annual averages since 1930 are given in table C.

Sex composition.--In 1950, for the first time in our history, the census showed more females than males in our population. At that time there were about 600,000 more women than men (including the Armed Forces abroad). By 1959, females outnumbered males by about 1.8 million. Females generally outnumber males in the adult age groups. There was an excess of 3.2 million females 25 years of age and over, and of about 1.5 million females 65 years and over in 1959. Males continued to outnumber females in the age group under 25 years, however.

Since 1910, the sex ratio (the number of males per 100 females) of the total population

has declined steadily; it is estimated at 98.0 for 1959. Table D shows the sex ratio for July 1 of each census year since 1900 and for July 1, 1959, for the total population and four broad age groups.

Color composition.--On July 1, 1959, the nonwhite population numbered about 19.8 million as compared with 15.8 million on April 1, 1950. With a gain of about 4.0 million, or 25.5 percent over the 1950 figure, the nonwhite population has grown at a substantially higher rate than the white population, which increased by about 16.2 percent during this period. This difference arises from the marked excess of the birth rate of nonwhites, which is only partially offset by a higher death rate. The proportion of nonwhites in the population increased between 1950 and 1959 from 10.4 percent to 11.2 percent. Between 1920 and 1950, there was little change in the proportion of nonwhites; it was 10.3 in 1920 and 10.2 in both 1930 and 1940. At the beginning of the century, however, nonwhites constituted 12.1 percent of the population.

Table E shows the percents of change, by broad age groups, between 1950 and 1959 for the white and nonwhite population. The percents of increase are consistently higher for the latter than for the former group.



The age and sex composition of the nonwhite population is rather different from that of the white population. Primarily as a result of its much higher birth rate, the nonwhite population is substantially "younger" than the white population, having a median age in 1959 of 22.9 years as compared with 30.2 years for the white population. The broad differences in the age-sex structure of the white and nonwhite population are illustrated by figure 2,

in which a "pyramid" representing the percent distribution of the nonwhite population (including Armed Forces abroad) by age and sex for July 1, 1959, is superimposed on the corresponding "pyramid" for the white population. This chart indicates strikingly the much larger proportion of the nonwhite population in the younger ages and the much smaller proportion in the older ages as compared with the white population.

Population residing in the United States and the civilian population.--Between April 1950 and July 1959, the population residing in the United States increased from 150.7 million to 176.4 million, or by 17.0 percent. The civilian population increased from 149.6 million to 174.6 million, or by 16.7 percent, during this same period. Changes in the resident and civilian population for the age groups 15 to 44 years, in comparison with those for the total population including Armed Forces abroad, are shown in table G. Changes in the age groups under 15 years and 45 years and over were, of course, the same or nearly the same for all three types of population.

#### METHOD AND SOURCES OF DATA

The estimates shown in this report are based on statistics from the 1950 Census of Population; statistics and estimates of births and deaths provided by the National Office of Vital Statistics, United States Public Health Service; statistics on the movement of civilian citizens and aliens to and from the United States provided by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice, supplemented by data provided by the governments of Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico; and data on the size and distribution of the Armed Forces obtained from the Department of Defense.

The estimates for July 1, 1959, were obtained by adding estimates for Alaska to estimates of the population of the United States (48 States and the District of Columbia) derived by carrying forward the corresponding estimates for July 1, 1958, for the 48 States and the District of Columbia. The estimates for July 1, 1959, given in table 1 (population

including Armed Forces abroad) were obtained by adding estimates of the civilian population of Alaska to estimates of the total population of the United States (48 States and the District of Columbia), including United States Armed Forces abroad, for that date. The estimates of the total population of the United States (48 States and the District of Columbia), including United States Armed Forces abroad, for a given age group, were obtained by subtracting from the number of persons in the corresponding group  $\frac{1}{2}$  years younger on April 1, 1950 (or from births since April 1950), an estimate of deaths during the period following the census, and adding or subtracting, as required, an estimate of migration across our national borders. For this purpose, an estimate of persons serving with the Armed Forces of the United States abroad on April 1, 1950, was added to the census count of persons residing in the 48 States and the District of Columbia. Current estimates of the civilian population of Alaska by age were obtained in a similar manner.

The postcensal estimates of the resident population in a given age group, shown in table 2, were obtained by adding estimates of the total population of Alaska to estimates of the total resident population in the 48 States and the District of Columbia. The latter estimates for each age group were previously obtained by subtracting an estimate of the number of persons serving in the Armed Forces abroad in that age group on each estimate date from the corresponding figures, including United States Armed Forces abroad. Similarly, the estimates of the civilian population shown in table 3 were obtained by subtracting the total number serving in the Armed Forces (both at home and abroad) at each estimate date from the figures for the 48 States and the District of Columbia, including Armed Forces abroad, and adding the civilian population of Alaska.

Data by single years of age for 1950 were required for making the annual postcensal estimates shown here. Such data were tabulated from the census on the basis of a 20-percent sample of the complete returns for the 48 States and the District of Columbia (and a complete count for Alaska). However, because of the considerable "heaping" on various ages, especially those ending in "0" and "5," the single-year-of-age tabulations were not used directly (except for Alaska). For the ages 15 years and over, adjusted single-year-of-age figures were derived by distributing the totals for 5-year age groups from the complete count by "5th-difference osculatory" interpolation. This form of interpolation provides a series of figures for single years of age which are consistent with the 5-year age totals as reported in the census and which show a smooth transition from one age group to the next. Because of the availability of a highly reliable series of figures on births in the United States for the period 1935 to 1950, mathematical interpolation was not used to derive single years of age for the under-15-year groups in 1950. For the ages 5 to 14, the total figures for the two age groups (5 to 9 and 10 to 14) from the complete count were distributed by single years of age in accordance with the distribution of survivors in 1950 of births for the years 1935 to 1945. For ages under 5, as explained further below, the figures represent survivors of births of the appropriate past years (April 1945 through March 1950), without adjustment to the reported census total for the under-5 group.

In the United States, as well as in many other countries, there has been a tendency for the census count to understate the number of young children to a greater extent than the number at the adjacent higher ages. On the basis of estimates of the number of children under 5 years of age for April 1, 1950, derived from statistics of births, deaths, and migration, it is estimated that the 1950 Census count for the United States (48 States and the District of Columbia) understated the number of children in this age group by about 802,000, or 4.7 percent. (Some of the understatement is accounted for by misreporting of age.) The net undercount for ages under 2 years is estimated to be much greater than for ages 2 to 4 years, however. The understatement amounted to 638,000, or 9.0 percent, for the former group and 164,000, or 1.6 percent, for the latter group (of which about 130,000 relates to ages 2 and 3). The differences in net undercounts by age introduce a problem of comparability in postcensal estimates based directly on the census figures as enumerated. If, for example, the census count under 2 years of age was used as the base for an estimate of children 2 and 3 years of age on April 1, 1952, the change from 1950 to 1952 in the number in the age group 2 and 3 years would reflect the difference of 508,000 in the net undercounts for the two age groups in 1950 (that is, 638,000 minus 130,000). Therefore, in preparing the estimates shown in this report, the 1950 figures for single years under age 5 used as a base for estimates of the 48 States and the District of Columbia were derived from births, not the census counts. At the same time, in order to maintain comparability with the 1950 Census figures, in the sense that the increase or decrease for a given age group between the census date and the estimate date would not include the net census undercount, the estimates of the "true" total number of children under 5 years of age, based on births, were deflated by the net census undercounts in the same age group. The last lines of table 1 show the estimates for the age groups under 1 year, 1 and 2 years, and 3 and 4 years, before deflation.

By the use of birth, death, and migration statistics, it was also possible to estimate the net undercounts (including misstatements of age) of children 5 to 14 years of age. However, since the adjustment for this age group would be somewhat smaller than that for children under 5 and also was believed to be less

reliable, it was considered desirable to retain the original census totals for the 5-to-9 and 10-to-14 age groups in making postcensal estimates (although the single years of age were adjusted as described above) and to make the adjustment for net census undercount only for children under 5 years. The actual estimates of the net census undercounts for these age groups by sex, as a percent of the estimated population, are as follows:

Census counts for other age groups are also affected by net under- or overcount. This situation seems to be particularly true of the age group 65 to 69, especially among the nonwhite population. The relatively large number reported for this age group interrupts a rather smooth decline in the size of successive age groups up the age scale. In order to assure a regular decline throughout the entire age span

55 to 69 years for nonwhites, the figures as enumerated for the 5-year age groups in this span were adjusted mathematically. The absolute adjustments were obtained by use of the observed ratios of the nonwhite to the white population at ages 55 and over and 70 and over and adjusted ratios at ages 60 and over and 65 and over. The adjusted ratios were derived by interpolation between the observed ratios for the several adjoining cumulated age groups. This procedure involves the assumption that the ratio of the nonwhite to the white population should progress fairly smoothly by age; and the use of cumulated totals ensures that the resulting adjustments add to zero for ages 55 and over. The numbers for the 48 States and the District of Columbia as reported in the census and the adjusted numbers for the nonwhite population are as follows:
