Estimates of the Population by Age, for States and Puerto Rico July 1, 1961

(Corresponding estimates for the 1950 decade which take account of the 1960 Census are not yet available)

This report presents estimates of the total resident population of States and of Puerto Rico, by broad age groups for July 1, 1961. The age groups shown are: Under 5 years, 5 to 17 years, 18 to 44 years, 45 to 64 years, and 65 years and over, as well as figures for the cumulative age groups 14 years and over, 18 years and over, and 21 years and over. These are the first State age estimates based on the results of the 1960 Census.

Methodology.--The estimates for all States were obtained by carrying forward the 1960 Census data (after subtraction of the estimated size of the Armed Forces) for each of the age groups for each State, and allowing for births, deaths, net civilian international and interstate migration, the net movement of civilians into the Armed Forces between April 1, 1960, and the estimate date, and the number of Armed Forces stationed in each State on the estimate date. The estimates were so adjusted that the sum of the estimates of the five broad age groups for each State equaled the estimate of the total resident population of that State published in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 258, and that the sum of the State estimates for each age group equaled the estimate of the total resident population of the United States in that age group shown in Series P-25, No. 265. The adjustments to State totals and national age groups were relatively minor, resulting in only slight changes in the initial estimates.

To estimate net civilian migration for a State, rates of migration were derived for each age group (except age 65 years and over) from the State's estimated migration rate for school-age children for the period April 1960 to July 1961. Migration rates for school-age children (ages 7.50 to 15.49) by States had previously been estimated in the course of preparing

the estimates of the total population of States for 1961 shown in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 258. (The method used in estimating migration rates for children of school age is described in that report. It employs data on elementary school enrollment and data on age from the 1960 Census.)

The net civilian migration rate, 1960 to 1961, for a given age group in a given State was derived by the following formula:

$$NM_{x \text{ to } y}^S = NM_{7.50 \text{ to } 15.49}^S \times \frac{GM_{x \text{ to } y}^{U.S.}}{GM_{7.50 \text{ to } 15.49}^{U.S.}}$$

where:

$NM_{x \text{ to } y}^S$ is the net migration rate for the given State for the age group x to y years,

$NM_{7.50 \text{ to } 15.49}^S$ is the net migration rate for the same State for the age group 7.50 to 15.49,

$GM_{x \text{ to } y}^{U.S.}$ is the gross interstate migration rate for the United States for the age group x to y,

$GM_{7.50 \text{ to } 15.49}^{U.S.}$ is the gross interstate migration rate for the United States for the age group 7.50 to 15.49.

The national interstate migration rates above are based on estimates of interstate migration by age obtained annually from the Current Population Survey, the Bureau's continuing national sample survey of the population.¹ The ratios of the national migration

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rates for broad age groups to the rates for the school-age population (7.50 to 15.49 years) for the period April 1960 to July 1961 are as follows:

Age group at estimate date	Ratio
Under 5 years.....	1.73
5 to 17 years.....	1.14
18 to 44 years.....	2.03
45 to 64 years.....	0.67

These are relationships among gross interstate migration rates. Separate ratios for individual States are not available. It is assumed here that these same ratios apply equally to all States, and hence, for a given State, that the direction of the net migration is the same for all of the broad age groups under 65. The method by which the ratios were derived from the Current Population Survey data is explained in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, Nos. 165 and 172.

Estimates of the migration between States of the group 65 years old and over were based on data on the interstate migration of "aged beneficiaries" for each State for the fiscal year 1959-60 obtained from the Social Security Administration. The reported numbers of beneficiaries who migrated were adjusted for difference between States in insurance coverage, based on labor force participation, and the State estimates were adjusted to tie in with the level of interstate migration of persons aged 65 and over for the United States for the period from April 1960 to July 1961 as estimated from the Current Population Survey.

In particular areas, different methods for estimating net civilian migration were used. For Alaska and Hawaii, data on aged beneficiaries were not available. Consequently, migration for ages 65 and over for these two States was estimated in the same manner as was that for other age groups. For Puerto Rico, estimates of the age distribution of migrants were based on survey data on passenger movement into and out of Puerto Rico, prepared by the Commonwealth government.

The net movement of civilians into the Armed Forces by age for each State was estimated by (1) subtracting (a) the number of persons serving in the Armed Forces on April 1, 1960, who reported the State as their preservice residence from (b) the number serving in the Armed Forces on the estimate date who reported the State as their preservice residence, and (2) adding an allowance for former residents of the State who died during this period while serving in the Armed Forces.

Population base.--This report makes use of the 1960 Census counts of population by age published in Final Report PC(1)-B for each State. In the use of the census numbers in the preparation of current estimates by age, there has been no adjustment for net undercounts either in the national or State data. Although some adjustment in each age group is theoretically possible, at this time it is not feasible to evaluate the net undercount or overcount for States.

No adjustment for underenumeration of children under 5 has been made as was done for estimates prepared

during the 1950's based on the 1950 Census counts. At the national level, estimates based on birth statistics indicate that for children under 5 there was a net undercount of only 2.6 percent in the 1960 Census, as compared with 4.7 percent in the 1950 Census. The net error in the age group under 5 now appears to be at the same general level as several older age groups and thus does not seem to require a unique adjustment of the population in this age group. (Corresponding estimates of net undercounts of children under 5 by State are not available. A more detailed discussion of the pros and cons of adjusting the 1960 Census age data preparatory to their use in postcensal age estimates is given in Series P-25, No. 265.)

Sources of data.--The estimates given in this report are based on age data from the 1960 Census; statistics on births and deaths provided by the National Vital Statistics Division, United States Public Health Service; statistics relating to the Armed Forces provided by the Department of Defense; and estimates of net interstate migration, developed in part from official records of school enrollment obtained from State Departments of Education, Catholic School systems throughout the country, and the Official Catholic Directory, and in part from statistics provided by the Social Security Administration on the movement of aged beneficiaries covered by old age and survivors insurance. The estimates of net civilian migration for Puerto Rico are based on statistics prepared by the Puerto Rico Department of Health and the Puerto Rico Planning Board.

The birth and death statistics used in preparing the estimates for States shown here include final statistics on registered births for 1960. Provisional data on births for 1961 and on deaths for 1960 and 1961, tabulated only on an occurrence basis, were adjusted to a residence basis. The birth and death statistics for Puerto Rico are classified on an occurrence basis only. The data on births have been corrected for underregistration. The factors used in correcting births for underregistration are extrapolations to the appropriate period of the indicated underregistration of births from the 1950 Birth Registration Test conducted by the National Office of Vital Statistics (now National Vital Statistics Division) in conjunction with the 1950 Census of Population.² Registered deaths for States were adjusted to national totals which included a correction for underregistration of deaths under 1 year of age.

Accuracy of estimates.--The estimates of the population aged 5 to 17 and aged 65 and over presented in this report are believed to have relatively higher accuracy than those of other age groups. This is because the estimates of migration are based on State

data relating directly to these two age groups. Also in the case of persons 65 years old and over, the estimated and expected migration is, in most cases, low and thus has comparatively little effect percentage-wise on the final estimate of population at these ages. The assumptions made as to net interstate migration for the other age groups are so broad that small or even moderate changes by age over the estimating period should be interpreted with caution. Accuracy tests made for the 1950-60 decade, however, suggest that most of the estimates should reflect the true level fairly well.

Related reports.--The estimates of the population of States by broad age groups contained in this report

are consistent with the estimates of the total population of States and outlying areas published in Current Population Reports, Series P-25, No. 258, and with national population estimates by age published in No. 265 of this series.

This report differs in coverage from earlier reports in Series P-25 relating to the population of States by broad age groups³ in that it covers the resident rather than the civilian population. As such, the estimates are directly comparable in coverage with the 1960 Census counts.
