Preface

The Current Population Report series has long been recognized as an important source of demographic information on a wide variety of population-related topics. This index is a reference source for data users of the Current Population Reports and the Household Economic Studies. It is designed to provide a ready resource for each subject with the relevant reports listed sequentially by series number and title. This guide lists subjects covered in these reports, but does not indicate all cross-classifications (e.g., by age, race, Hispanic origin, or sex) or the historical data shown in some tables.

Much of the current population data from the Census Bureau are derived from the Current Population Survey (CPS) and the Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP).

CURRENT POPULATION SURVEY

The Current Population Survey is a household sample survey of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States. Its primary task is to produce monthly statistics on unemployment and the labor force, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in its monthly bulletin, "Employment and Earnings."

The CPS also serves as a vehicle for supplemental studies on subjects other than employment. From the basic and supplemental data, the Bureau issues three series of publications:

P-20 Population Characteristics

Regularly recurring reports in this series contain data on geographical mobility, fertility, school enrollment, educational attainment, marital status, households and families, persons of Hispanic origin, voter registration and participation, and various other topics. In 1989, regular reports on the Black population (formerly in Series P-23) and the Farm population (formerly Series P-27) were added.

P-23 Special Studies

Information pertaining to methods, concepts, or specialized data is furnished in these publications. Also included are focussed analyses of demographic subjects of topical interest and occasional reports on metropolitan-nonmetropolitan population, youth, women, the older population, and other topics.

P-60 Consumer Income

Information concerning families, individuals, and households at various income levels is presented in this group of reports. Data are also presented on noncash benefits and the relationship of income to age, sex, race, Hispanic origin, family size, education, occupation, work experience, and other characteristics.

Users can order series subscriptions or purchase individual reports. Current Population Survey microdata files on computer tape also are available.

Occasional reports in the P-20, P-23, and P-60 series are designated as "research/developmental" reports, as indicated by the notation "RD" in the identification number. Such reports cover information in the developmental stage, and not yet considered to be official statistics.

SURVEY OF INCOME AND PROGRAM PARTICIPATION

P-70 Household Economic Studies

The Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP) is another national survey conducted by the Census Bureau. Its principal purpose is to provide better estimates of the economic situation of families and individuals. Recurrent questions deal with employment, types of income, participation in government programs, and noncash benefits. Periodically, questions are added dealing with school enrollment, marital history, migration, child care, disability, and other topics. From time to time, special supplemental questions also will be added.

The data from SIPP are available in both reports and microdata tape files. Users may order individual reports or arrange an annual subscription.

POPULATION ESTIMATES AND PROJECTIONS

P-25 Population Estimates and Projections

Monthly estimates of the total United States population, annual midyear estimates of the U.S. population by age, sex, race, and State estimates by age and sex, and projections for the United States and States, are included

in this group of reports and data files. Beginning in 1988, U.S. estimates include Hispanic data. Annual estimates also are published for Puerto Rico and the outlying areas.

Beginning the 1980's, reports and data files presenting local area population and per capita income estimates are released as part of the P-26 series.

P-26 Local Population Estimates¹

These reports and related data files provide annual population estimates for counties and metropolitan areas (MA's) using standardized methodology mutually agreed upon by the Census Bureau and the responsible State

agency under the Federal-State Cooperative Program for Population Estimates. County and MA estimates from 1981 to 1985 were released in individual state reports. Beginning 1986, county estimates appeared in one comprehensive report and, beginning in 1988, MSA estimates also were published in a single report for the year.

Beginning in 1982, biennial population and per capita income estimates for counties and 36,000 local government jurisdictions also are included. Previously such estimates were provided in the P-25 series. The 1982 estimates were published in individual State reports. Beginning in 1984, the estimates were released by State in five regional reports (Northeast, East North Central, West North Central, South, and West). There can also be occasional research/developmental reports in these series. Users can order series subscriptions or purchase individual reports.
