CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

Introduction.—This chapter gives the population of Alabama, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 24) shows the population of Alabama, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties is alphabetical, while the primary divisions in each county are given in numerical order. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

It may be noticed that the county totals as given in Table 1 for 1900 and 1890 sometimes exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table. This is for the most part due to territorial changes that have been made in the minor civil divisions of certain counties, and to the formation of a new county, since 1890. In other cases certain divisions returned separately at one census were returned in combination with other divisions at another census. In some counties detailed comparison for the earlier censuses can not be made except for a few incorporated places.

Table 2 (p. 36) shows the cities and incorporated towns and villages of Alabama, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Alabama, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive;

the increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

Density of population.—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

Minor civil divisions.—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated towns, boroughs, or villages. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

Urban and rural population defined.—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions as they existed at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in

HISTORICAL NOTE.—Alabama takes its name from an Indian tribe which at one time lived in that region. The name probably means "glade" or "thicket cleared of trees."

The territory now constituting Alabama was first explored in 1540 by the Spaniard, De Soto, who passed through it on his way from Florida to the Mississippi. The first permanent settlement was made by the French on Mobile Bay in 1702, and was removed to the present site of Mobile in 1711.

Toward the close of the seventeenth century France asserted its title to this region, basing its claim on the discoveries of Marquette and Joliet, who descended the Mississippi to the Arkansas in 1673, and of La Salle, who sailed down the Mississippi to its mouth in 1682. England, too, claimed the region north of the Gulf of Mexico, and the territory now forming Alabama was included wholly or in part by the Carolina charters of 1663 and 1695 and by the Georgia charter of 1732.

In 1763 the territory now forming Alabama was ceded by France to Great Britain. In the same year the province of Florida was transferred to Great Britain by Spain and not long afterwards was divided into East and West Florida. West Florida was extended westward to the Mississippi and northward to the latitude of the mouth of the Yazoo (about 32° 30'), and thus included the southern part of the Alabama region. At the close of the Revolution all the present area of Alabama

except that portion lying south of the thirty-first parallel was ceded by Great Britain to the United States. The Floridas were transferred by Great Britain to Spain at the same time, and for more than a decade the title to what is now southern Alabama was in dispute between the United States and Spain. In 1795, however, the latter country relinquished its claims to the territory north of the thirty-first parallel, and three years later this territory was organized as Mississippi territory.

In 1787 a narrow strip in the northern part of the present state of Alabama was ceded by South Carolina to the United States and a few years later was organized as part of the southwest territory. The region between this territory and Mississippi territory continued in the possession of Georgia until 1802, when it was ceded to the National Government. Two years later the limits of Mississippi territory were extended so as to include all the present state of Alabama except the small area lying south of the thirty-first parallel. This area was in dispute between the United States and Spain after the Louisiana purchase in 1803, and during the War of 1812 was taken from Spain and added to Mississippi territory. Spain, however, did not formally relinquish its claim until the Florida cession in 1819.

Alabama, with boundaries as at present, was organized as a territory in March, 1817, and became a state in December, 1819.

1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately

reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—The population of Alabama is 2,138,093. Compared with a population of 1,828,697 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 309,396, or 16.9 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The growth of the state during this decade was somewhat slower than during

the preceding decade, 1890–1900, when the rate was 20.8 per cent.

The following table shows the population of Alabama at each census from 1820 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Alabama was organized as a territory in 1817 and appears in the Federal census reports for the first time in 1820. During the decade 1820–1830 the growth of the state was very rapid, there being an increase of 142 per cent. In the following decade the rate of increase was 90.9 per cent. In 1840 the population of the state was somewhat over four and one-half times as great as in 1820. During the next 70 years the population increased at a much slower rate, the percentages of increase ranging from 30.6 in 1850 to 16.9 in 1910, except for the decade 1860–1870 when the rate of growth was only 3.4 per cent. In 1910 the population of the state was somewhat over three and one-half times as great as it was in 1840.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States, as given in the preceding table, shows that from 1820 to 1840 the increase during each decade was much greater for the state than for the country as a whole. From 1840 to 1910 during every decade except one the rates of increase for the state were lower than those for the United States, and in this one decade, 1890–1900, the rate of the state exceeded that of the country as a whole by only one-tenth of 1 per cent.

Principal cities.—Alabama has 36 cities. Birmingham, the largest, has a population of 132,685, and Mobile, the second city, a population of 51,521. Mont-

gomery, with 38,136 inhabitants, is the only other city in the state having over 25,000 inhabitants. There are also 4 cities having from 10,000 to 25,000, 5 having from 5,000 to 10,000, 12 having from 2,500 to 5,000, and 12 having less than 2,500 inhabitants.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the state with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table on page 19 shows the population of the seven cities having in 1910 over 10,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their incorporation either as cities or towns, so far as figures are available, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Birmingham shows the highest rate of increase during the last decade, namely, 245.4 per cent, and Montgomery the lowest, 25.7 per cent. Gadsden also shows a very high rate of increase, 146.5 per cent. Montgomery is the only city showing a lower rate of increase during the last decade than during the preceding decade.

In 1910 Birmingham contributed 6.2 per cent of the total population of the state as compared with 2.1 per cent in 1900. During the last decade the increase in the population of this city was 94,270, or almost two and one-half times its population in 1900. This increase is due in part to annexations to its territory during the last decade.

Counties.—Alabama has 67 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 12,855 in Winston County to 226,476 in Jefferson County.

The following territorial changes have been made in the counties of Alabama since 1900: Part of Blount County was annexed in 1901 to Cullman County; part of Cleburne County was annexed in 1907 to Calhoun County; and parts of Dale, Geneva, and Henry Counties were taken in 1903 to form Houston County.

Owing to the organization since 1900 of one new county from parts of three other counties as shown above, the comparison of increase or decrease in population is made for only 63 counties and the one combination of counties. The combined counties are Dale, Geneva, and Henry with Houston. In order to determine the actual rate of increase for these counties, it is necessary to add the population of the new county to that of the old counties from which it was formed. Fifty-one counties and the one combination of counties in the state increased in population during the last decade. The rates of increase for the 51 counties range from 1.4 per cent in Cleburne County to 109.3 per cent in Covington County, and the absolute increases of the same group of counties range from 179 in Cleburne County to 86,056 in Jefferson County. The combined counties of Dale, Geneva, Henry, and Houston increased in population 24,763, or 32.4 per cent. Twelve counties decreased in population during the last decade, the rates of decrease ranging from 1.8 per cent in Perry County to 12.3 per cent in Sumter County, and the absolute decreases from 561 in Perry County to 4,011 in Sumter County. The aggregate increase of population from 1900 to 1910 in the 51 counties and the one combination of counties that showed increases was 333,246; the aggregate decrease

of the population in the 12 counties that showed decreases was 23,850. The difference, 309,396, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

The maps on page 22 show the increase or decrease in the total and the rural population, respectively, of each county of Alabama during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 51,279 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 41.7; in 1900 and 1890 it was 35.7 and 29.5, respectively. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 23, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Baldwin County, with 1,595 square miles, has the largest area, and Etowah County, with 542 square miles, has the smallest area. Jefferson County, containing the city of Birmingham, has the highest density of any county, namely, 199.5 persons per square mile, while Baldwin County, with 11.4 persons per square mile, has the lowest density.

Minor civil divisions.—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Alabama the counties are divided into 1,283 primary divisions, comprising 1,282 election precincts and 1 independent city. There are also 260 secondary divisions, comprising 198 towns, 27 villages, and 35 cities. These secondary divisions usually form parts of the precincts in which they are

located. There are, however, three cities which are coextensive with the precinct or precincts in which they are located, and one city which comprises several precincts and parts of other precincts.

Urban and rural population compared.—The following table presents the population of Alabama at the

censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

As shown by the above table, the urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, the cities and incorporated towns of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 370,431 inhabitants, or 17.3 per cent of the total population, while 1,767,662 inhabitants, or 82.7 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, the cities and incorporated towns then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 216,714 inhabitants, or 11.9 per cent of the total population, while 1,611,983 inhabitants, or 88.1 per cent, lived in rural territory. The proportion of urban population in 1910 was slightly less than one and one-half times as large as it was in 1900. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

A comparison of the figures for 1910, 1900, and 1890 as given in this table shows that in 1910 the three cities of over 25,000 inhabitants—namely, Birmingham, Mobile, and Montgomery—contained 10.4 per cent of the population of the state; in 1900 the corresponding percentage was 5.9. In 1890 Birmingham and Mobile, the only cities having at that time over 25,000 inhabitants, contained 3.8 per cent of the total population of the state. The population of urban places having less than 25,000 inhabitants comprised 6.9 per cent of the total population of the state in 1910, while in 1900 and 1890 the proportion shown was 6 and 6.3 per cent, respectively.

The urban population of the state is contained in 24 cities and 4 towns. Of the total population, 82.7 per cent is classed as rural, 7.7 per cent being contained in 233 incorporated places of less than 2,500 inhabitants each and 75 per cent in unincorporated territory.

The 233 places of less than 2,500 inhabitants each have an aggregate population of 164,511. These

places comprise 55 having from 1,000 to 2,500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 84,944; 66 having from 500 to 1,000 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 45,807; and 112 having less than 500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 33,760.

The above table shows further that in all incorporated places, including those of less than 2,500 inhabitants, there was in 1910 a population of 534,942, or 25 per cent of the population of the state. The population of all incorporated places as they existed in 1900 was 322,124, or 17.6 per cent of the population of the state.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that 16 counties and the one combination of counties had a larger proportion and 3 counties a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900, while 41 counties were wholly rural at both censuses. Two counties which were wholly rural in 1900 were partly urban in 1910 and 1 county which was partly urban in 1900 was wholly rural in 1910.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the table on page 21, the total population in 1910 of the cities and towns which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 370,431; in 1900 the total population of the same places was 237,670. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of those cities and towns which at that time had over 2,500

inhabitants each, 216,714 (see table on page 20), by 20,956. The difference is the net result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class and vice versa, and of annexations of territory during the same period.

A comparison of the total population in 1910 of cities and towns having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the next table, shows an increase of 55.9 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the state, increased 11.1 per cent. The population of urban areas thus increased over five times as rapidly as rural population. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent. As shown by Table I of Chapter 2, there are 12 counties in which the population living in rural territory decreased and 2 counties in which there was a decrease in urban population during the last decade, Barbour being the only county that decreased in population in both urban and rural districts.

In the following table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the population of the city of Birmingham, the combined population of the other cities having in 1910 25,000 inhabitants or more, the combined population of cities and towns having in 1910 from 2,500 to 25,000

inhabitants, and the population of the remainder of the state.

From this table it appears that the urban territory increased in population much more rapidly than the state as a whole. The rate of increase for the city of Birmingham was over eight times the rate for the state as a whole, while the rate of increase for the group of other cities having 25,000 inhabitants or more was less than one and one-half times, and that for the group of places having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants was more than twice the rate for the state. The rate of increase for rural territory was 11.1 per cent as compared with 16.9 per cent for the state as a whole.

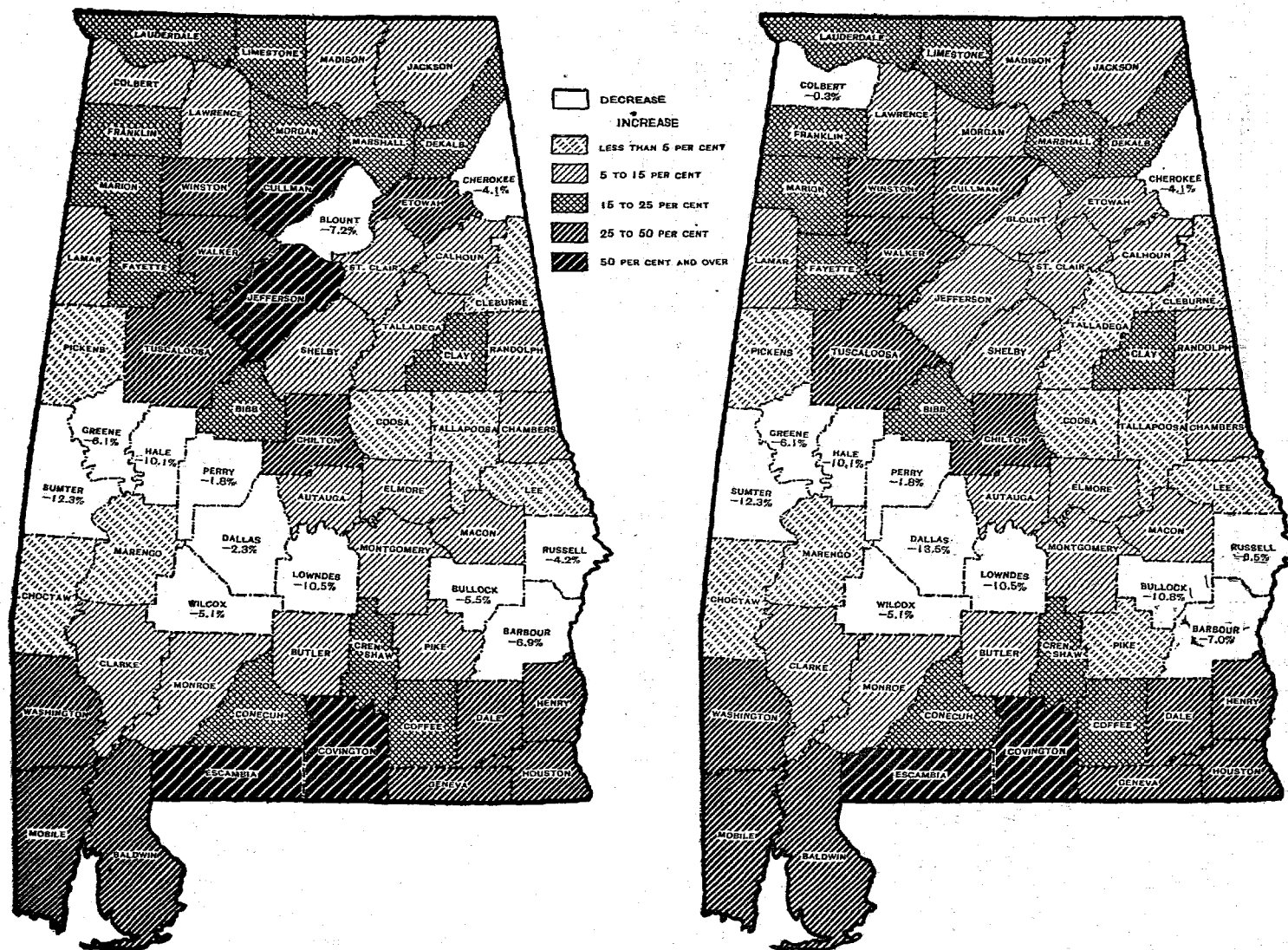
It also appears from this table that of the increase in the total population of the state during the decade, namely, 309,396, more than one-half, or 176,635, was in rural territory. The city of Birmingham contributed 76,926, or considerably over one-half the entire increase (132,761) shown for urban territory.

TOTAL POPULATION.

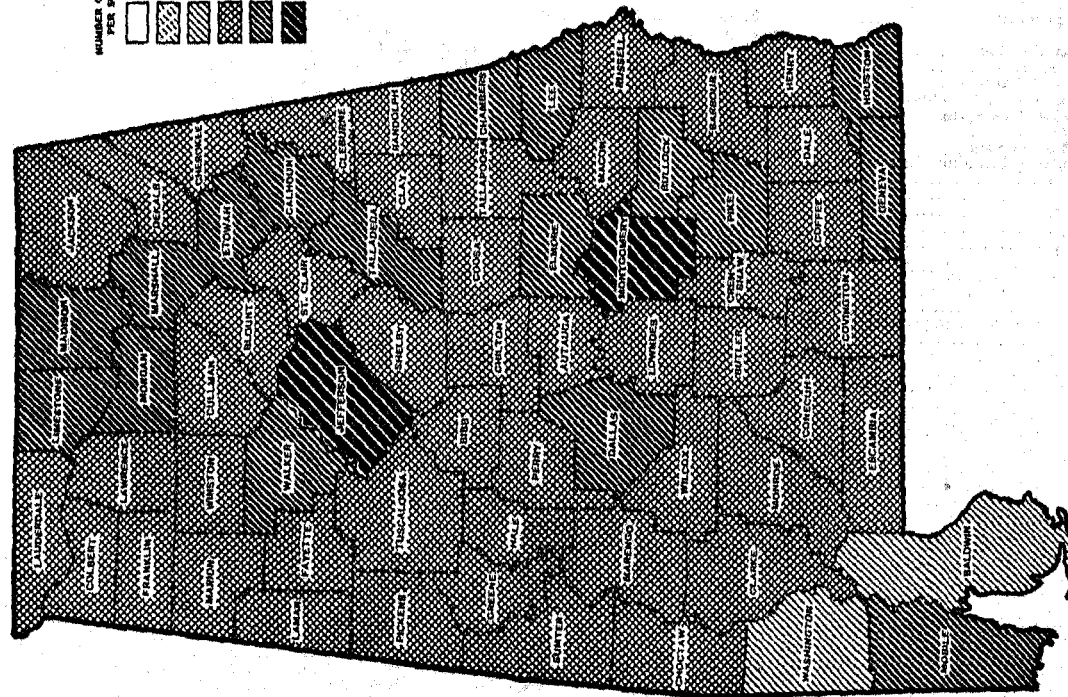
RURAL POPULATION.



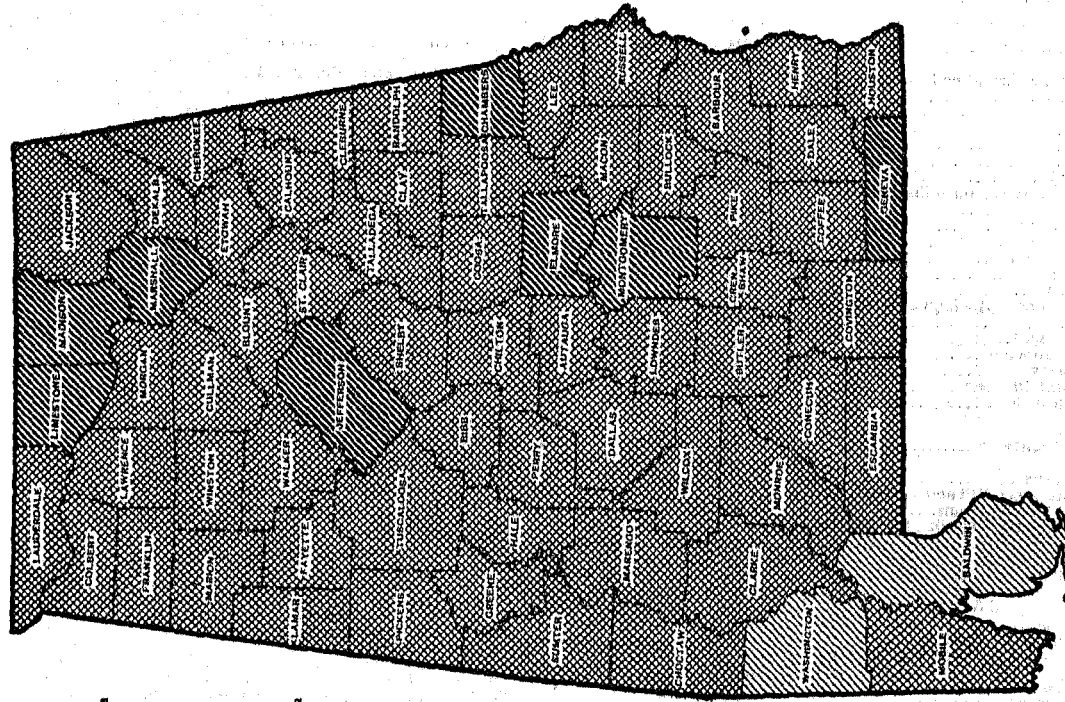

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CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

Introduction.—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of Alabama by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

Description of the tables.—The greater part of this chapter consists of five general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for cities of 25,000 inhabitants or more; Table III for cities of 10,000 to 25,000; Table IV for places of 2,500 to 10,000; and Table V for wards of cities of 50,000 or more.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 15) reproduces from the general tables the more important state and city totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among the different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had at-

tended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

Color and nativity (Table 1).—Of the total population of Alabama, 1,228,832, or 57.5 per cent, are whites, and 908,282, or 42.5 per cent, negroes. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 54.7 and 45.2, respectively. In each of 21 counties negroes constitute half or more of the population, and in 11 of them the proportion is fully three-fourths. (See map on page 45.)

Native whites of native parentage constitute 55.1 per cent of the total population of the state, and 95.8 per cent of the white population. Native whites of foreign or mixed parentage constitute only 1.5 per cent of the total population, and foreign-born whites 0.9 per cent.

Of the urban population, 49.8 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural, 56.2 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 5.1 and 0.8 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 2.9 in the urban population and 0.5 in the rural; the percentage of negroes is 42.3 in the urban and 42.5 in the rural.

Sex (Table 2).—In the total population of the state there are 1,074,209 males and 1,063,884 females, or 101 males to 100 females, as compared with a ratio of 100.5 in 1900. Among the whites there are 103.8 males to 100 females; among the negroes, 97.2. For all native whites combined the ratio is 103.1 to 100, as compared with 165.9 to 100 for the foreign-born whites. In the urban population there are 95.9 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 102.1.

State of birth (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the native population—that is, population born in the United States—87.7 per cent were born in Alabama and 12.3 per cent outside the state; of the native white population 15.9 per cent were born outside the state, and of the native negro, 7.5 per cent. Persons born outside the state constitute a much larger proportion of the native population in urban than in rural communities.

Foreign nationalities (Tables 5 and 12).—Of the foreign-born white population of Alabama, persons born in Germany represent 19 per cent; Italy, 14.2; England, 12.4; Russia, 8.1; Ireland, 6.2; Scotland, 5.9; Austria, 4.8; Canada, 4.3; Sweden, 4; all other countries, 21.2 per

cent. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Germany contributed 23.6 per cent; England, 13.6; Ireland, 11.8; Italy, 9.1; Scotland, 6.9; Russia, 5.1; Canada, 3.9; France, 3.4; Austria, 3.2 per cent.

Voting and militia ages (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 513,111, representing 24 per cent of the population. Of such males, 58.3 per cent are white and 41.7 per cent negroes. Native whites represent 56.2 per cent of the total number and foreign-born whites 2.1 per cent. Of the 10,521 foreign-born white males of voting age, 4,736, or 45 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 401,145.

Age (Tables 7, 8, and 13).—Of the total population, 39.7 per cent are under 15 years of age, 20.6 per cent are from 15 to 24 years, inclusive, 24.5 per cent are from 25 to 44, and 15 per cent are 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 6.6 per cent being under 15 years of age while more than three-fourths (80.4 per cent) are 25 years of age and over. The negro population comprises a somewhat smaller proportion of children under 5 than the native white population of native parentage.

The urban population shows a smaller proportion of children than the rural and a larger proportion of persons in the prime of life. Migration to the city explains this at least in part. Of the urban population, 32.8 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 22.8 per cent.

School attendance (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 750,357, of whom 385,449, or 51.4 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 5,042 persons under 6 and 6,354 of 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 51.2; for girls, 51.5. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 61.1. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage was 78.1 per cent; among foreign-born whites, 70.2 per cent; among native whites of native parentage, 70 per cent; and among negroes, 49.3 per cent. (See Table I.) In urban communities the percentage of children of that age attending school was 70.7, and in rural, 59.6.

Illiteracy (Table 10).—There are 352,710 illiterates in the state, representing 22.9 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 34 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 40.1 among negroes, 9.9 among native whites, and 11.3 among foreign-born whites. It is 10.1 for native whites of native parentage and 2.3 for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage.

For all classes combined, illiterates are relatively fewer in urban than in rural communities, 13 per cent

as against 25.2. This difference between urban and rural appears in each class of the population except foreign-born whites, most of whom arrive in this country when past the school age, and among whom the percentage of illiteracy is practically the same in urban as in rural communities.

For persons from 10 to 20 years of age, inclusive, whose literacy largely depends upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is 10.4. (See Table I.)

Marital condition (Tables 11 and 14).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 34.5 per cent of the males are single and 26.3 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 60 for males and 60.3 for females, and the percentage widowed 4.9 and 12.4, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 0.4 and 0.9, respectively, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due largely to the fact that women marry younger. Thus, 19.1 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 2.2 per cent of the males; and 61.7 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years are married, as compared with 38 per cent of the males. In the next age group, 25 to 34 years, the difference largely disappears. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is in fact more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 64 per cent for males, 71.2 per cent for females; native whites of native parentage, 60.3 and 62.4, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 52.6 and 52.7; negroes, 59.7 per cent for males and 57.7 per cent for females.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married, both for males and females, is higher in rural than in urban communities.

Dwellings and families.—The total number of dwellings in Alabama is 441,249, and the total number of families 454,767, indicating that in very few cases does more than one family occupy a dwelling. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 4.8, and the average number per family, 4.7.

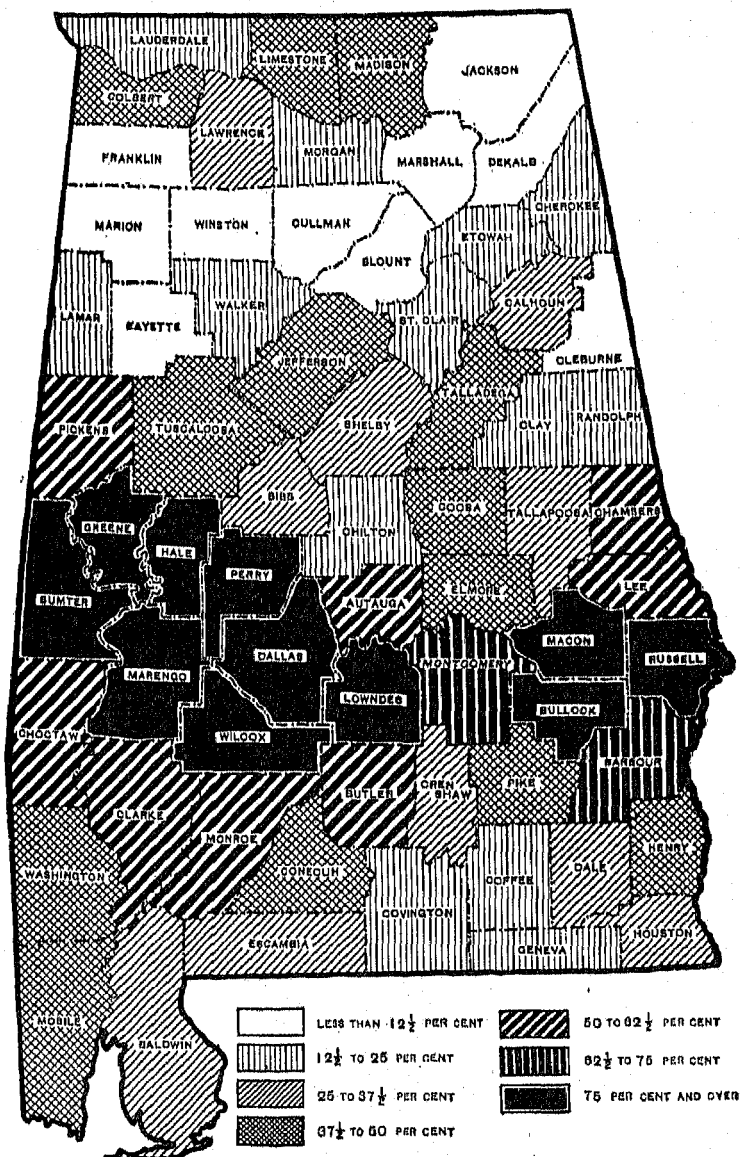

ARIZONA.

CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

Introduction.—This chapter gives the population of Arizona, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 71) shows the population of Arizona in 1910, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, and, so far as possible, in comparison with similar figures for 1900 and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical, except in the few counties in which some or all of the primary divisions are numbered. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

The population of the territory in 1910 was returned by election precincts and other minor civil divisions; in 1900 and 1890 it was not returned by election precincts. For this reason it is possible to present comparable figures for only the cities, towns, and Indian reservations which were returned separately at one or both of the previous censuses.

Table 2 (p. 73) shows the cities and incorporated towns in Arizona, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Arizona, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not appar-

ent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

Density of population.—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

Minor civil divisions.—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, school districts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as incorporated villages or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

Urban and rural population defined.—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions *as they existed* at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the territory as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

HISTORICAL NOTE.—The name Arizona is of Spanish-Indian origin and is variously stated to signify "small or few springs," "little creek," and "silver bearing."

The first recorded exploration of the region now constituting Arizona was made in 1539 by the Spaniard, Marcos de Niza, who was sent out from Mexico to confirm the rumors of great wealth which de Vaca had heard of in his wanderings. In 1540 Coronado traversed the region in his journey northward. The earliest settlements were made by Spanish missionaries toward the close of the seventeenth century.

This region formed a part of Mexico, which was under the dominion of Spain until by the Mexican Revolution of 1821 it achieved its independence. In February, 1848, at the close of the Mexican War, Mexico ceded to the United States her claims to territory north of the Rio Grande and Gila River and extending westward to the Pacific Ocean, and in December, 1853, by the Gadsden purchase, the United States acquired from Mexico a strip of territory bounded on the north principally by the Gila River and on the south by the present Mexican line.

In 1850 a territorial form of government had been established for New Mexico, which at that time extended westward to the California boundary, and in 1854 the territory acquired by the Gadsden purchase was added to New Mexico. In 1863, by authority of an act of Congress passed in February of that year, the territory of Arizona was organized, with boundaries as at present, except that the northern line extended westward to California. The boundary between Arizona and Nevada was established at its present location in 1866.

In June, 1910, Congress passed an act to enable Arizona and New Mexico to form state constitutions and governments and to be admitted to the Union. In December of that year, a proposed state constitution for Arizona was adopted by a convention held at Phoenix and was ratified by the people in February, 1911. This constitution received the conditional approval of the Federal Government in August, 1911, and was referred to the people of the territory for amendment. February 14, 1912, the territory became a state of the Union.

POPULATION—ARIZONA.

TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the territory.¹—The population of Arizona is 204,354. Compared with a population of 122,931 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 81,423, or 66.2 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The percentage of increase for the population of the territory during this

decade was a little more than one and two-thirds that for the preceding decade, 1890–1900.

The following table shows the population of Arizona at each census from 1870 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Arizona was organized as a territory¹ in 1863 and appears in the Federal census reports for the first time in 1870. During the 20 years from 1870 to 1890 the growth was very rapid, its population increasing a little more than four times during the decade 1870–1880 and a little more than doubling during the decade 1880–1890. The absolute increase for this 20-year period was 78,585. Since 1890 the growth has been somewhat slower, the population increasing 116,111, or 131.6 per cent.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the territory with those for the United States as a whole, as given in the preceding table, shows that during each decade the population of the territory increased much more rapidly than that of the United States. The greatest difference between the two rates was during the decade 1870–1880, when the population of the territory increased 318.7 per cent and that of the country as a whole 30.1 per cent, and the smallest difference during the decade 1890–1900, during which period the population of Arizona increased 39.3 per cent and the population of the United States 20.7 per cent.

Principal cities.—Arizona has eight cities, of which the largest, Tucson, has a population of 13,193, and the second city, Phoenix, a population of 11,134. Tombstone, with 1,582 inhabitants, is the smallest city. The aggregate population of the eight cities is 58,414, or 28.6 per cent of the total population of the territory.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the territory, with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table in the next column shows the population of the six cities having in 1910 over 5,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their incorporation as cities, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Phoenix, Tucson, and Prescott show increases during the last decade of 100.8, 75.2, and 43.1 per cent, respectively. No figures of increase can be given for either Bisbee, Douglas, or Globe, as they have been incorporated since 1900. Phoenix and Tucson show a higher rate of increase during the last decade, 1900–1910, than during the preceding decade, 1890–1900.

Counties.—Arizona has 13 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 3,773 in Mohave County to 34,591 in Cochise County.

There have been no changes in the territorial boundaries of the counties since 1900.

Each county in the territory has increased in population during the last decade, the rates of increase ranging from 10.1 per cent in Mohave County to 273.9 per cent in Cochise County, and the absolute increases from 347 in Mohave County to 25,340 in Cochise County.

The maps on page 69 show the increase in the total and the rural population, respectively, of each county of Arizona during the last decade, the different rates of increase being indicated by differences in shading.

Density of population.—The total land area of the territory is 113,810 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 1.8; in 1900 and 1890 it was 1.1 and 0.8, respectively. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 70, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Coconino County, with 18,238 square miles, has the largest area, and Santa Cruz County, with 1,229 square miles, has the smallest area. Cochise County, with 5.6 persons per square mile, has the highest density. Apache, Coconino, Mohave, and Yuma Counties each average less than 1 person per square mile.

Minor civil divisions.—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Arizona the counties are

divided into 155 primary divisions, comprising 132 election precincts, 3 cities, 4 incorporated towns, and 16 school districts. There are also 15 secondary divisions, comprising 5 cities and 10 incorporated towns. Of these, one incorporated town is coextensive with the election precinct in which it is located, the others forming parts of their respective precincts or townships. Besides these minor civil divisions duly organized for governmental purposes there are 32 unorganized townships, 31 unincorporated towns, 7 unincorporated villages, and 11 Indian reservations and part of another in the territory. These are returned under the counties in which they are wholly or partly located. Population not included in any of the specified divisions is shown under the title "Remainder of county."

Urban and rural population compared.—The following table presents the population of Arizona at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among cities and towns grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

As shown by the above table, the urban territory of Arizona in 1910—that is, the cities and incorporated towns of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 63,260 inhabitants, or 31 per cent of the total population, while 141,094 inhabitants, or 69 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, the cities and incorporated towns then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 19,495 inhabitants, or 15.9 per cent of the total population, while 103,436 inhabitants, or 84.1 per cent, lived in rural territory. There has thus been a large increase in the proportion of urban population during the last decade. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

In 1910 Tucson and Phoenix, the two cities in Arizona having over 10,000 inhabitants, contributed 11.9 per cent of the total population of the territory, which was a slight increase over the proportion in these two

cities in 1900, when they comprised the group of places having from 5,000 to 10,000 inhabitants each. The largest proportion of the urban population in the territory in 1910 was contained in the four cities which had from 5,000 to 10,000 inhabitants each.

The above table shows further that in all cities and incorporated towns, including those of less than 2,500 inhabitants, there was in 1910 a population of 79,666, or 39 per cent of the population of the territory. The population of all cities and incorporated towns, as they existed in 1900, was 28,344, or 23.1 per cent of the population of the territory.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that of the three counties of Arizona which contained urban population in 1900, two had a larger proportion and one a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900, while of the remaining counties which were wholly rural in 1900, five showed a considerable proportion of urban population in 1910.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view, places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the table in the next column, the total population in 1910 of the cities and towns which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 63,260; in 1900 the total population of these same places (so far as separately reported) was 21,409. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of the cities and towns which at that time had over 2,500 inhabitants each, 19,495 (see table on p. 67), by 1,914. The difference is the net result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class and vice versa.

In the following table the population for the territory as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the combined population of cities and towns

having in 1910 2,500 inhabitants or more and the population of the remainder of the territory.

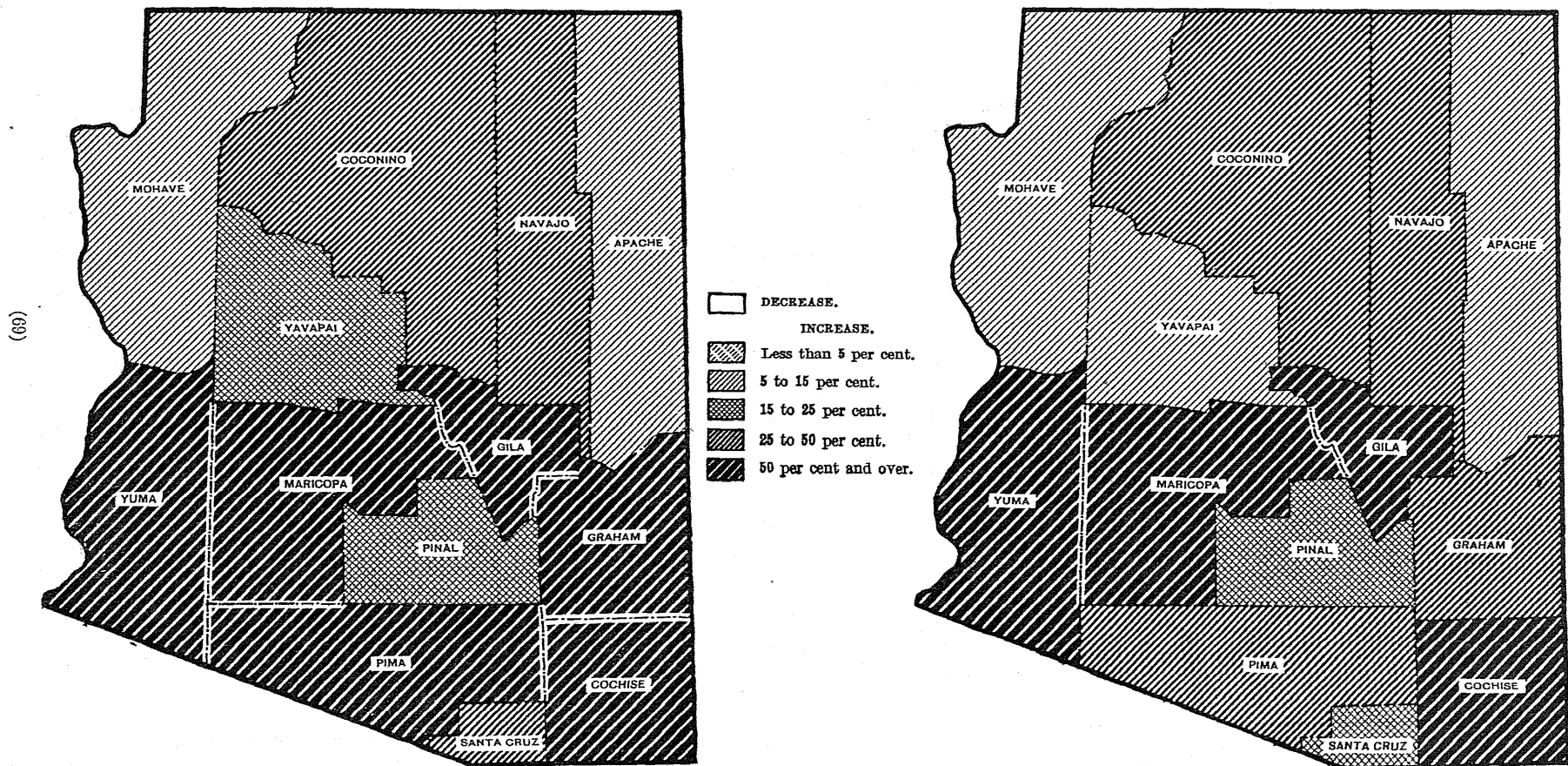
A comparison of the total population in 1910 of cities and towns having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the table above, shows an increase of 195.5 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the territory, increased 39 per cent. Urban population thus increased a little more than five times as rapidly as that of rural territory. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent.

TOTAL POPULATION.

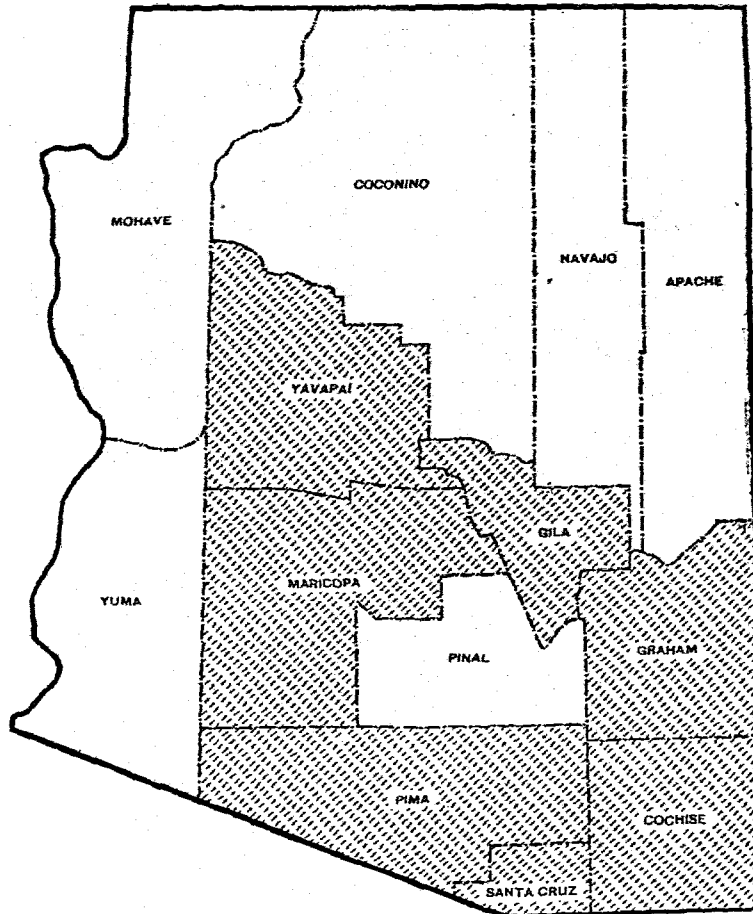
RURAL POPULATION.



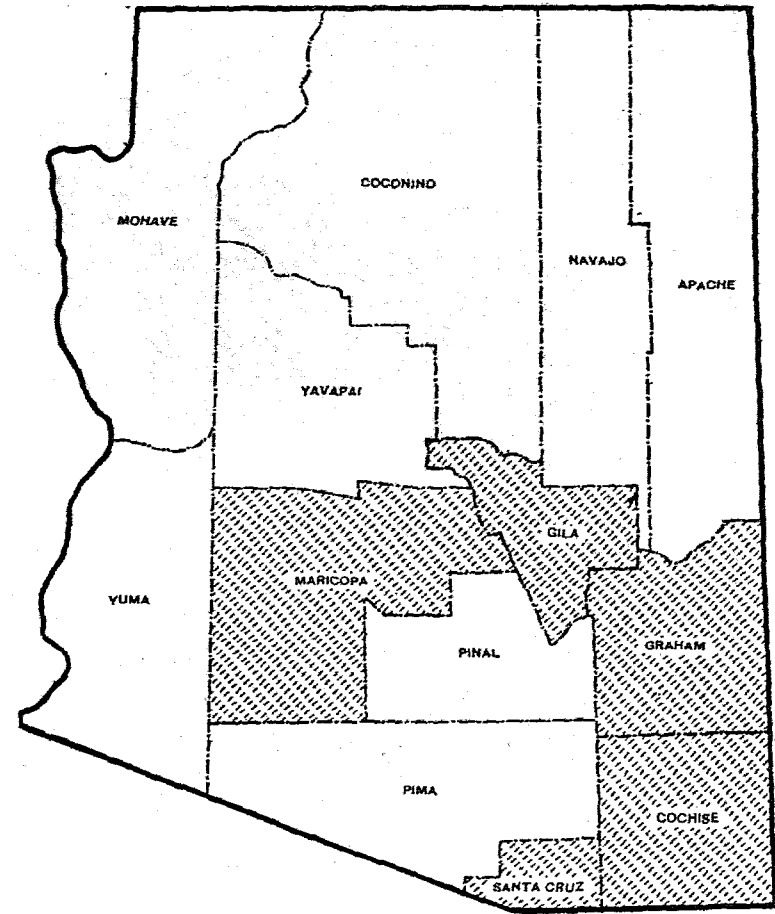

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CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

Introduction.—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of Arizona by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

Description of the tables.—The greater part of this chapter consists of three general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for the two cities of over 10,000 inhabitants; and Table III for places of 2,500 to 10,000.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 12) reproduces from the general tables the more important state totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among the different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had attended any

kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

Color and nativity (Table 1).—Of the total population of Arizona, 82,468, or 40.4 per cent, are native whites of native parentage; 42,176, or 20.7 per cent, are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage; 46,824, or 22.9 per cent, are foreign-born whites; and 29,201, or 14.3 per cent, are Indians. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 36.5, 20.9, 18.2, and 21.5, respectively. In 8 of the 13 counties at least 20 per cent of the population is white of foreign or mixed parentage, and in 7 counties more than 20 per cent is foreign-born white. In Santa Cruz County 42.3 per cent of the population is foreign-born white, and only 22.8 per cent is native white of native parentage. (See maps on page 81.)

Of the urban population, 42.1 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural, 39.6 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 26.1 and 18.2 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 27.2 in the urban population and 21 in the rural; the percentage of Indians is 1.2 in the urban and 20.1 in the rural. The Indian population is almost exclusively rural, only 2.6 per cent living in urban communities.

Sex (Table 2).—In the total population of the state there are 118,574 males and 85,780 females, or 138.2 males to 100 females. In 1900 the ratio was 140.4 to 100. Among native whites the ratio is 129.3; among foreign-born whites, 188.4; and among the Indians, 106.4 to 100. In the urban population there are 126 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 144.2.

State of birth (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the native population—that is, population born in the United States—50.7 per cent were born in Arizona and 49.3 per cent outside the state; of the native white population, 59.5 per cent were born outside the state; of the native Indians, 1.9; and of the native negroes, 85.5 per cent.

Foreign nationalities (Table 5).—Of the foreign-born white population of Arizona, persons born in Mexico represent 62.9 per cent; England, 7.5; Germany, 3.9; Canada, 3.9; Ireland, 3.3; Italy, 3.3; Austria, 3.2; Spain, 1.8; Sweden, 1.8; Scotland, 1.2; Finland, 1.2; all other countries, 6. Of the total white stock of

foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Mexico contributed 57.4 per cent; England, 8.2; Germany, 6.3; Ireland, 5.5; Canada, 4.4; Italy, 2.5; Austria, 2.2; Sweden, 1.8; Scotland, 1.7; Spain, 1.

Voting and militia ages (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 74,051, representing 36.2 per cent of the population. Of such males, 38.8 per cent are native whites of native parentage, 14.4 per cent native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 34.7 per cent foreign-born whites, 9 per cent Indians, 2 per cent Chinese and Japanese, and 1 per cent negroes. Of the 25,682 foreign-born white males of voting age, 5,912, or 23 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 58,962.

Age (Tables 7 and 8).—Of the total population, 12.1 per cent are under 5 years of age, 19.6 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 18.7 per cent from 15 to 24, 33.7 per cent from 25 to 44, and 15.6 per cent 45 years of age and over. The proportion of children is highest among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, and next highest in the Indian population. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 11 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while 70 per cent are 25 years of age and over. Of the native whites of native parentage, less than one-half (47.3 per cent) are 25 and over, and of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage only a little more than one-third (35.3 per cent).

The urban population shows a smaller proportion of children than the rural and a larger proportion of persons in the prime of life. Of the urban population, 37.1 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 32.1 per cent.

School attendance (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 56,897, of whom 30,355, or 53.4 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 490 persons under 6 and 501 of 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 52.5; for girls, 54.3. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 67.2. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of native parentage was 80.4; among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 72.1; among foreign-born whites, 61.6; among Indians, 34.1. Of the small number of negro children aged 6 to 14 years 81.5 per cent were attending school. (See Table I.) The percentage attending school for children aged 6 to 14 is higher in urban than in rural communities.

Illiteracy (Table 10).—There are 32,953 illiterates in the state, representing 20.9 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 29 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 72.9 in the Indian population, 31.5 among foreign-born whites, 7.2 among negroes, and 4.2 among native whites.

For all classes combined, the percentage illiterate is 9.9 in the urban population, and 26.1 in the rural. For each element of the population the percentage illiterate is higher in rural than in urban communities.

For persons from 10 to 20 years, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is 18. (See Table I.)

Marital condition (Table 11).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 45.8 per cent of the males are single and 22.2 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 47.7 for males and 65.7 for females, and the percentage widowed 4.4 and 10.5, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 0.8 and 1, respectively, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men, though partly accounted for by the excess of males in the total population of the state, is due largely to the fact that women marry younger than men. Thus 20.3 per cent of the females and only 2 per cent of the males from 15 to 19 years of age are married; 64.5 per cent of the females and 20.6 per cent of the males from 20 to 24 years; 82.5 per cent of the females and 51.9 per cent of the males from 25 to 34 years; and 83.2 per cent of the females and 66.5 per cent of the males 35 to 44 years of age. In the age group 45 and over the difference practically disappears, the percentage married being 61.3 for females and 62.5 for males. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is in fact more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 47.9 for males and 68.2 for females; native whites of native parentage, 46.5 and 66.4, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 40.7 and 60.2; Indians, 61.6 and 67.6.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married for females is higher in rural than in urban communities; for males the percentages are practically the same.

Dwellings and families.—The total number of dwellings in Arizona is 45,386, and the total number of families 47,927, there being 105.6 families to each 100 dwellings. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 4.5, and the average number per family, 4.3.

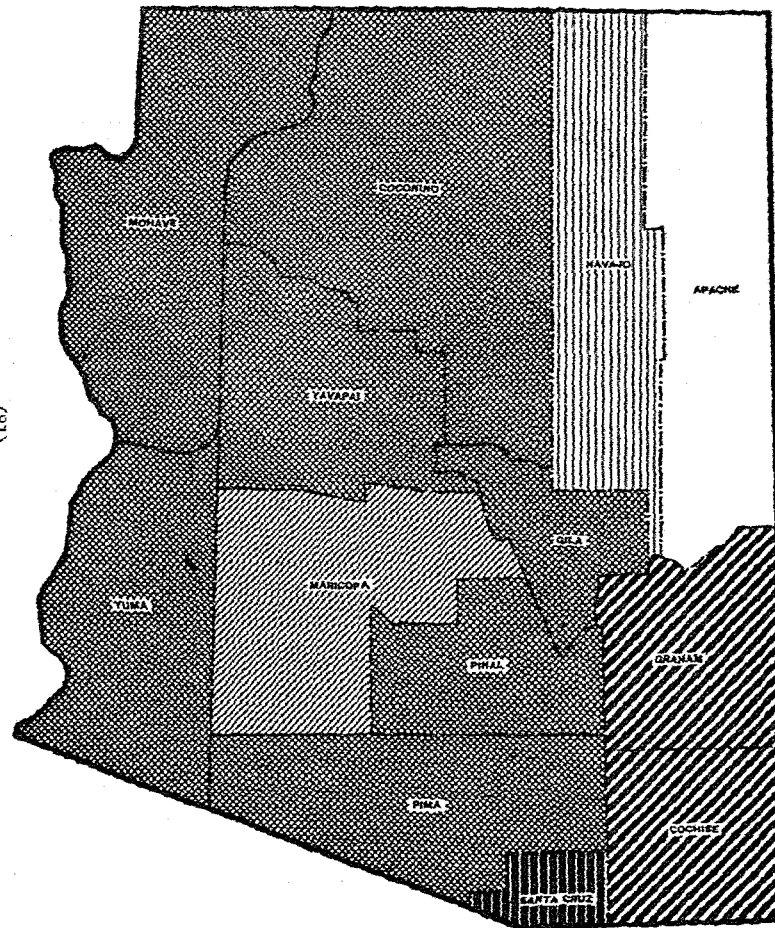

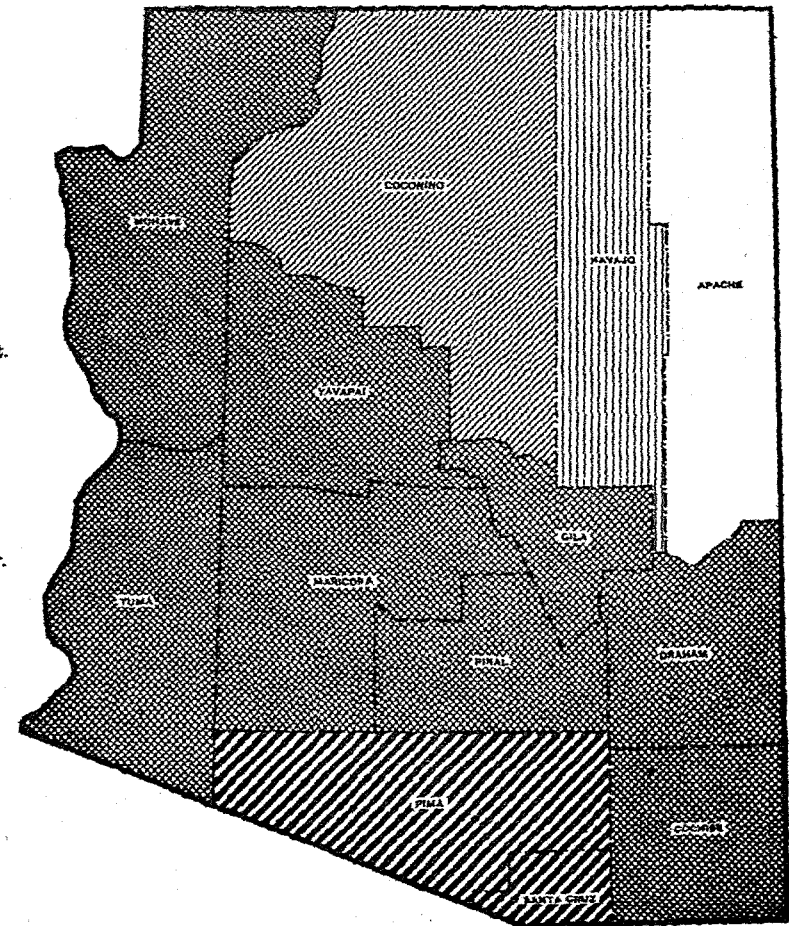

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ARKANSAS.

CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

Introduction.—This chapter gives the population of Arkansas, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 96) shows the population of Arkansas, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

It may be noticed that the county totals as given in Table 1 for 1900 and 1890 sometimes exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table. This is due to the territorial changes that have been made in the minor civil divisions of certain counties since 1890.

Table 2 (p. 108) shows the cities and the incorporated towns of Arkansas, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Arkansas, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained as follows:

HISTORICAL NOTE.—Arkansas takes its name from the Akansa tribe of Indians which once inhabited part of the territory now constituting this state.

The Arkansas country was first visited by white men in 1541, when the Spanish explorer, De Soto, crossed the Mississippi near the present site of Memphis and penetrated to the northern part of the present state. The first white settlement was made at Arkansas Post by the French in 1686.

Arkansas was formed from a portion of the territory originally known as Louisiana. This region was claimed by the French by virtue of the discoveries of Marquette and Joliet, who descended the Mississippi as far as the mouth of the Arkansas in 1673, and of La Salle, who sailed down the Mississippi to its mouth in 1682. The Louisiana region was ceded by France to Spain in 1762, retroceded to France in 1800, and purchased from France by the United States in 1803. It then included practically all the western watershed of the Mississippi, but its western boundaries were not definitely fixed until 1819.

Density of population.—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used, as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

Minor civil divisions.—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, towns, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

Urban and rural population defined.—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions *as they existed* at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

In 1804 the region was divided by the thirty-third parallel, the present southern boundary of Arkansas, into the territory of Orleans on the south and the district of Louisiana on the north. In the following year the district of Louisiana was named the territory of Louisiana, and in 1812 it was renamed the territory of Missouri.

Arkansas was erected successively into a territory of the first and second class by the acts of Congress of March, 1819, and of April, 1820; it then included, in addition to the area of the present state, that portion of the territory now forming Oklahoma which lay south of 36° 30' north latitude. In 1824 the western boundary, north of the Red River, was placed about 40 miles west of where it now stands, and in 1828 it was fixed at its present location. In January, 1836, a convention met at Little Rock, drew up a state constitution, and applied for admission into the Union. On June 15 of the same year Arkansas became a state of the Union.

TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—The population of Arkansas is 1,574,449. Compared with a population of 1,311,564 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 262,885, or 20 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The growth of the state was somewhat more rapid than during the pre-

ceding decade, 1890–1900, when the rate was 16.3 per cent.

The following table shows the population of Arkansas at each census from 1810 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

The earliest population figures for Arkansas are those reported at the Federal census of 1810, when its population was returned as in the territory of Louisiana. Arkansas was organized as a territory in 1819, and its population was reported for the first time in the Federal census reports of 1820. Between 1820 and 1860 the population of the state increased at a very rapid rate, the population in 1860 being about thirty and one-half times as great as in 1820. Since 1860 the growth of the state, though substantial, has been much slower and at a more irregular rate than during the previous years. The population in 1910 was more than three and one-half times that in 1860.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States as a whole, as given in the preceding table, shows that from 1810 to 1890 the rate of increase for the state was higher than the rate for the United States during every decade except one, 1860–1870, when the rate for the state was only one-half that shown for the country as a whole. Aside from this decade that from 1880 to 1890 is the only one during this 80-year period in which the rate of increase for the state was less than double that for the country as a whole.

During the last two decades the growth of the state has been slower than that of the country as a whole, the rates of increase for the 20 years being 39.6 per cent for the state and 46.1 per cent for the United States.

Principal cities.—Arkansas has 28 cities. Little Rock, the largest, has a population of 45,941, and Fort Smith, the second city, a population of 23,975. Pine Bluff, Hot Springs, and Argenta, with 15,102, 14,434, and 11,138 inhabitants, respectively, are the other cities in the state having over 10,000 inhabitants. There are also 4 cities having from 5,000 to 10,000, 13 having from 2,500 to 5,000, and 6 having less than 2,500 inhabitants.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the state with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table on page 91 shows the population of the five cities having in 1910 over 10,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their incorporation either as cities or towns, so far as figures are available, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Fort Smith shows the highest rate of increase during the last decade, namely, 106.9 per cent, and Little Rock the lowest, 19.9 per cent. In connection with the figures given in the table it should be explained that in 1904 what was then the eighth ward of Little Rock was detached to form the city of Argenta, Ark. This ward had a population of 4,751 in 1900 and 2,637 in 1890, so that the population of Little Rock, exclusive of that ward, was 33,556 in 1900, and 23,237 in 1890. By using these figures in comparing the growth of Little Rock, it appears that the increase from 1900 to 1910 was 12,385, or 36.9 per cent, as compared with an increase from 1890 to 1900 of 10,319, or 44.4 per cent.

Counties.—Arkansas has 75 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 8,946 in Stone County to 86,751 in Pulaski County.

The following territorial changes have been made in the counties of Arkansas since 1900: Part of Columbia County was annexed to Lafayette County in 1901; part of Scott County was annexed to Logan County in 1903; part of Lauderdale County, Tenn., was ceded to Arkansas and annexed to Mississippi County in 1905; and part of Indian Territory was annexed to Sebastian County in 1905.

Sixty-five counties increased in population during the last decade, the rates of increase ranging from 1.7 per cent in Sevier County to 86 per cent in Mississippi County, and the absolute increases from 277 in Sevier County to 23,572 in Pulaski County. Thirty-four counties show a higher rate of increase than is shown for the state as a whole, which, as before stated, was 20 per cent. Ten counties decreased in population during the last decade, the rates of decrease ranging from 1 per cent in Little River County to 19.2 per cent in Madison County, and the absolute decreases from 134 in Little River County to 3,808 in Madison County. The aggregate increase of population from 1900 to 1910 in the 65 counties that showed increases was 276,762; the aggregate decrease of population in the 10 counties that showed decreases was 13,877. The difference, 262,885, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

The maps on page 94 show the increase or decrease in the total and in the rural population, respectively, of each county of Arkansas during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 52,525 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 30; in 1900 and 1890 it was 25 and 21.5, respectively. The aver-

age number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 95, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Union County, with 1,048 square miles, has the largest area, and Lafayette County, with 525 square miles, has the smallest area. Pulaski County, containing Little Rock city, has the highest density of any county, namely, 116.1 persons per square mile, while Newton County, with 12.5 persons per square mile, has the lowest density.

Minor civil divisions.—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Arkansas the counties are divided into 1,347 primary divisions, comprising that number of townships. There are also 305 secondary divisions, comprising 28 cities and 277 incorporated towns. These secondary divisions form parts of the townships in which they are wholly or partly located.

Urban and rural population compared.—The following table presents the population of Arkansas at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among cities and towns grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census. For the purposes of this table Texarkana city is included in the group of urban places having from 10,000 to 25,000 inhabitants, although it had a population of only 5,655 in 1910, 4,914 in 1900, and 3,528 in 1890. This is due to the fact that Texarkana city, Ark., and Texarkana city, Tex., each separately incorporated, are together commonly known as Texarkana city, which had a joint population of 15,445 in 1910, 10,170 in 1900, and 6,380 in 1890.

As shown by the above table, the urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, cities and incorporated towns of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 202,681 inhabitants, or 12.9 per cent of the total population, while 1,371,768 inhabitants, or 87.1 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, the cities and incorporated towns then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 111,733 inhabitants, or 8.5 per cent of the total population, while 1,199,831 inhabitants, or 91.5 per cent, lived in rural territory. The proportion of urban population in 1910 was, therefore, about one and one-half times as great as in 1900. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

The proportion of the total population of the state in cities of over 10,000 inhabitants in 1910, 1900, and 1890 (considering Texarkana in this group in 1910 and 1900) was 7.4, 5.1, and 3.3 per cent, respectively; the proportion in urban places of less than 10,000 inhabitants for the same years was 5.5, 3.5, and 3.2 per cent, respectively.

The urban population of the state is contained in 22 cities and 6 towns, while the rural population is in 277 incorporated places of less than 2,500 inhabitants each, and in the unincorporated territory. The 277 places of less than 2,500 inhabitants each have an aggregate population of 174,764, representing 11.1 per cent of the total population of the state. These places comprise 54 having from 1,000 to 2,500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 89,424; 67 having from 500 to 1,000 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 46,417; and 156 having less than 500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 38,923. The population living in unincorporated territory represents 76 per cent of the total.

The above table shows further that in all cities and incorporated towns, including those of less than 2,500 inhabitants, there was in 1910 a population of 377,445, or 24 per cent of the population of the state. The population of all cities and incorporated towns, as they

existed in 1900, was 224,808, or 17.1 per cent of the population of the state.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that of the 15 counties of Arkansas which contained urban population in 1900, 12 had a larger proportion and 3 a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900, while of the remaining counties which were wholly rural in 1900, 12 showed a considerable proportion of urban population in 1910.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the next table, the total population in 1910 of the cities and towns which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 202,681; in 1900 the total population of these same places (so far as separately reported) was 131,719. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of the cities and towns which at that time had over 2,500 inhabitants each, 111,733 (see above table), by 19,986. The difference is the net result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class and of the annexation of territory during the same period.

A comparison of the total population in 1910 of the cities and towns having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the table on page 93, shows an increase of 53.9 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the state, increased 16.3 per cent. The population of urban areas thus increased more than three and one-fourth times as fast as rural. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent. As shown by Table I of Chapter 2 there

are 10 counties in which the population living in rural territory decreased and one, Carroll County, in which there was a decrease in population in both urban and rural districts.

In the next table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the population of the city of Little Rock, the combined population of the cities and towns having in 1910 from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants, and the population of the remainder of the state.

From this table it appears that the city of Little Rock increased in population about one and four-fifths times as rapidly as the state as a whole, while the rate of increase for the group of cities and towns having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants was almost three times that for the state as a whole. The comparison shows that the rate of increase of the population in the city of Little Rock was considerably lower than the rate for the smaller cities,

that is, those places having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants each.

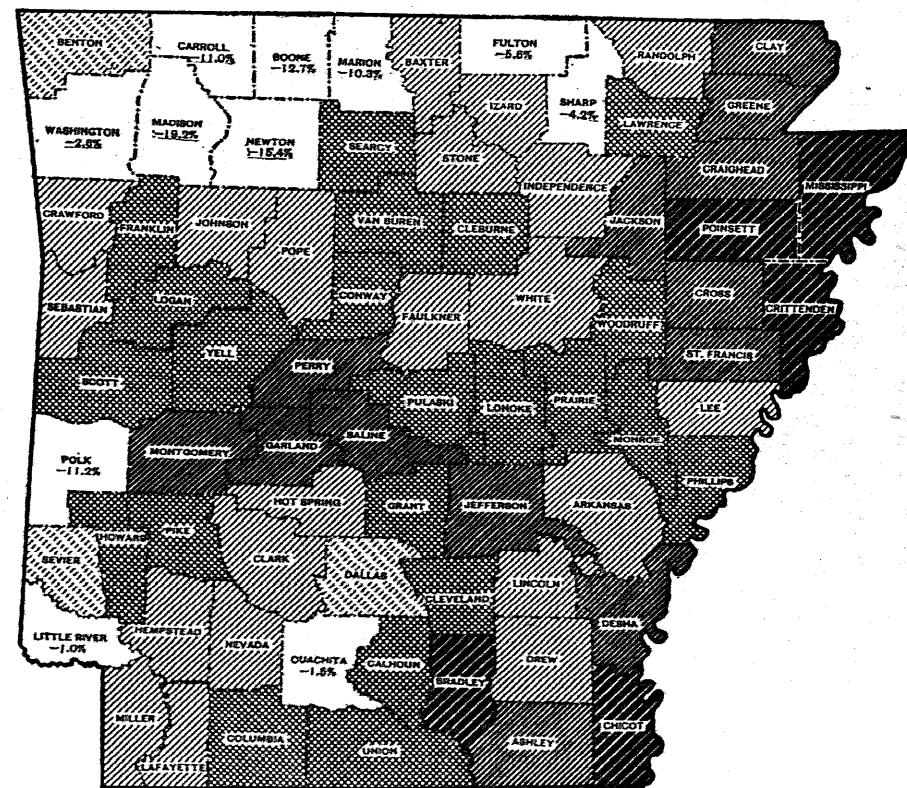
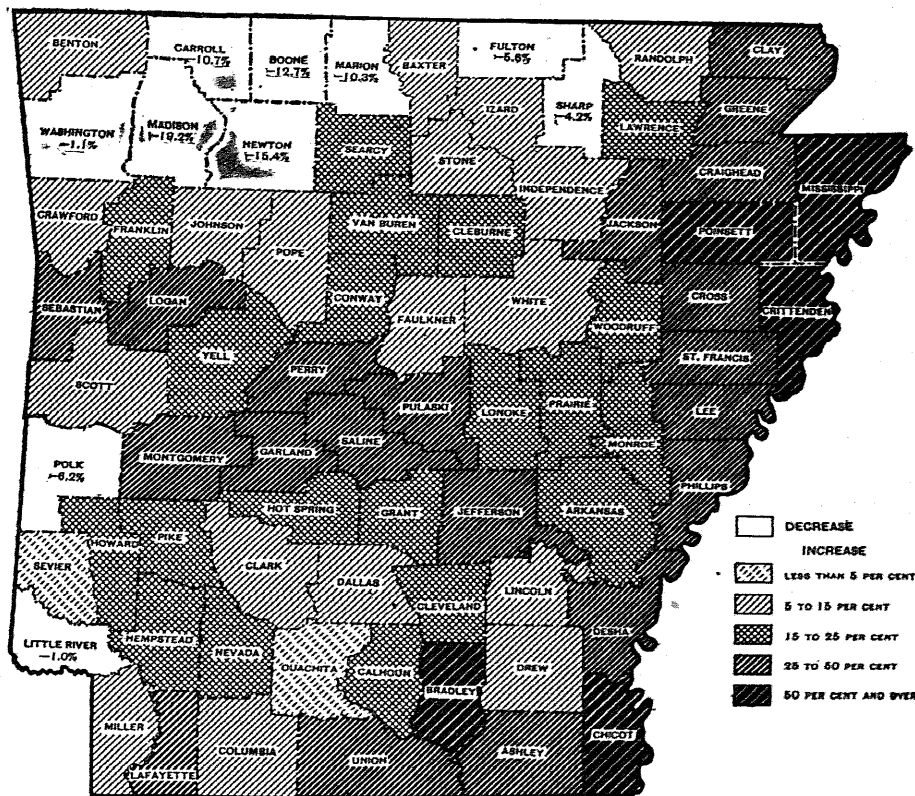
It also appears from this table that of the entire increase in urban population (70,962) for the last decade, Little Rock contributed 12,385, or 17.5 per cent, while the cities and towns of from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants each contributed 58,577, or 82.5 per cent.

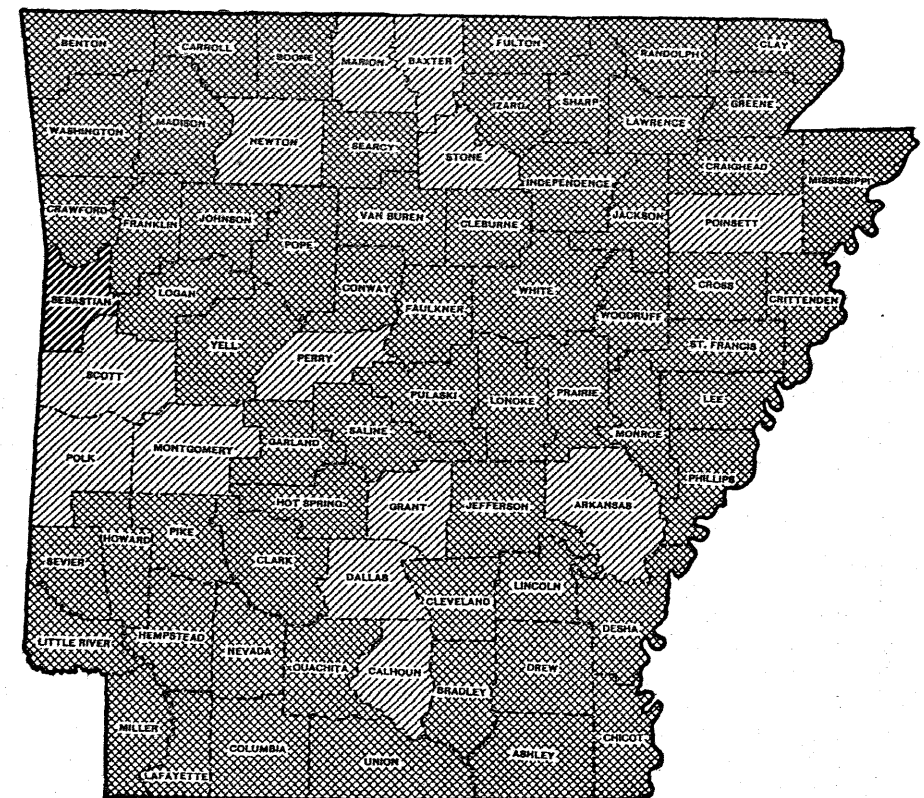
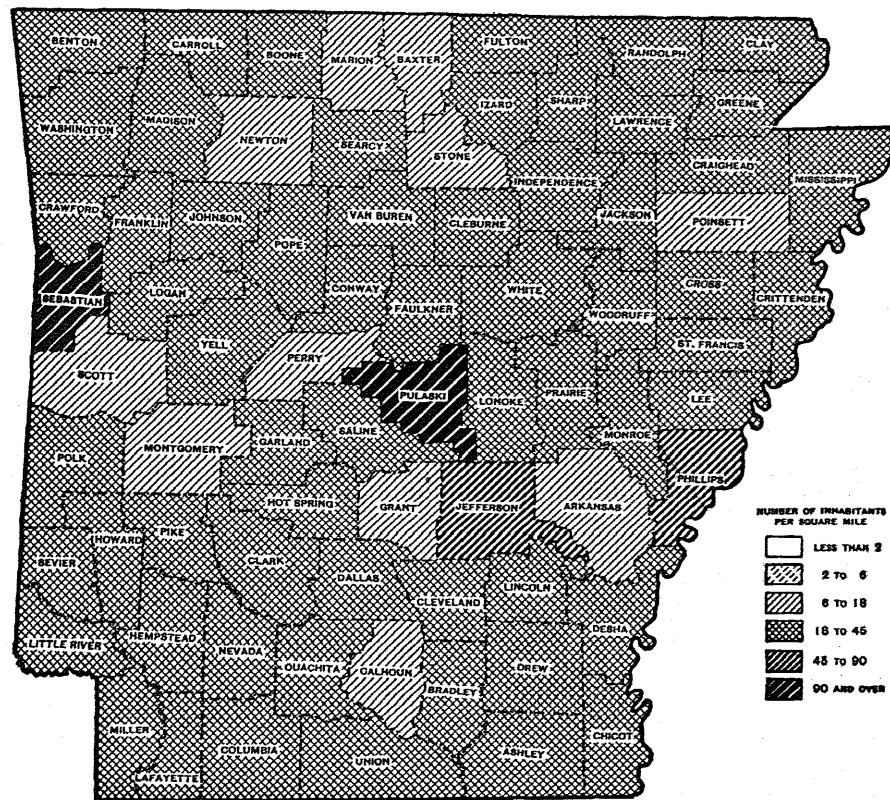

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CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

Introduction.—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of Arkansas by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census, except occupations and ownership of homes.

Description of the tables.—The greater part of this chapter consists of four general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for Little Rock, the only city of more than 25,000 inhabitants; Table III for cities of 10,000 to 25,000; and Table IV for places of 2,500 to 10,000.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 14) reproduces from the general tables the more important state and city totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had at-

tended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age and over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

Color and nativity (Table 1).—Of the total population of Arkansas, 1,131,026, or 71.8 per cent, are whites, and 442,891, or 28.1 per cent, negroes. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 72 and 28, respectively. In 14 of the 75 counties more than half of the population are negroes, the highest percentages being 84.6 in Crittenden County, 80.4 in Chicot, 79.4 in Desha, 78.6 in Phillips, and 78.4 in Lee; in 26 counties, on the other hand, negroes form less than 5 per cent of the total. (See map on p. 117.)

Native whites of native parentage constitute 68.4 per cent of the total population of the state, and 95.3 per cent of the white population. Native whites of foreign or mixed parentage constitute only 2.3 per cent of the total population, and foreign-born whites 1.1 per cent.

Of the urban population, 61 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural population, 69.5 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 6.7 and 1.7 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 3 in the urban population and 0.8 in the rural; the percentage of negroes is 29.2 in the urban and 28 in the rural.

Sex (Table 2).—In the total population of the state there are 810,026 males and 764,423 females, or 106 males to 100 females. In 1900 the ratio was 106.1 to 100. Among the whites there are 107.7 males to 100 females; among the negroes 101.7. For all native whites combined the ratio is 107 to 100, as compared with 168.3 to 100 for the foreign-born whites. In the urban population there are 100.4 and in the rural 106.8 males to 100 females, the urban population being very nearly evenly divided by sex, while in the rural the males outnumber the females.

State of birth (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the native population—that is, population born in the United States—67.8 per cent were born in Arkansas and 32.2 per cent outside the state; of the native white population, 31.8 per cent were born outside the state, and of the native negro, 33.1 per cent. Persons born outside the state constitute a much larger proportion of the native population in urban than in rural communities.

Foreign nationalities (Table 5).—Of the foreign-born white population, persons born in Germany represent 34.4 per cent; Italy, 10; England, 9; Austria, 7.5; Ireland, 6.4; Canada, 6.3; Switzerland, 4.8; Rus-

sia, 4.5; Scotland, 2.6; France, 2.3; Sweden, 2.3; other countries, of which 8 are specified in Table 5, 10.2 per cent. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Germany contributed 38.5 per cent; England, 10.7; Ireland, 10.4; Canada, 5.7; Italy, 5; Austria, 4.8; Switzerland, 3.7; Scotland, 3.2; France, 2.6; Russia, 2.6 per cent.

Voting and militia ages (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 395,824, representing 25.1 per cent of the population. Of such males, 71.8 per cent are white and 28.1 per cent negroes. Native whites represent 69.4 per cent of the total number and foreign-born whites 2.5 per cent. Of the 9,718 foreign-born white males of voting age, 5,284, or 54.4 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 311,792.

Age (Tables 7, 8, and 12).—Of the total population, 14.7 per cent are under 5 years of age, 24.7 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 20.6 per cent from 15 to 24, 25.1 per cent from 25 to 44, and 14.7 per cent 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 5 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while more than five-sixths (85.4 per cent) are 25 years of age and over. The negro population comprises a somewhat smaller proportion of children under 5 than the native white population of native parentage.

The urban population shows a smaller proportion of children than the rural, and a larger proportion of persons in the prime of life. Migration to the city explains this at least in part. Of the urban population, 33.2 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 23.9 per cent.

School attendance (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 551,672, of whom 324,035, or 58.7 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 4,324 persons under 6 and 5,436 of 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 58.7; for girls, 58.8. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 70.1. The percentage for children of this age was highest in the small group of native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 81.2, followed by native whites of native parentage, 74.7; negroes, 58.2; and foreign-born whites, 55.8. (See Table I.) In urban communities the percentage of children of that age attending school was 82.3 and in rural, 68.8.

Illiteracy (Table 10).—There are 142,954 illiterates in the state, representing 12.6 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 20.4 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 26.4 among negroes, 8.9 among foreign-born whites, 7.1 among native whites of native parentage, and 2.8 among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage.

Illiterates are relatively fewer in urban than in rural communities, the percentages being 6.4 and 13.6, respectively. This difference between urban and rural communities appears in each class of the population, although in other sections of the country the percentage for foreign-born whites, most of whom arrive in this country when past the school age, is practically the same in urban as in rural communities.

For persons from 10 to 20 years of age, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is 7.8. (See Table I.)

Marital condition (Tables 11 and 13).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 34.3 per cent of the males are single and 23.7 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 58.9 for males and 64 for females; and the percentage widowed 5.9 and 11.3, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 0.5 and 0.8, respectively, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due largely to the fact that women marry younger. Thus, 21.1 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 2 per cent of the males; and 65.2 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years are married, as compared with 35.9 per cent of the males. For those from 25 to 34 the percentages are, respectively, 83.3 and 73.7. In the next age group, 35 to 44 years, the difference practically disappears. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 63.9 for males, 69 for females; native whites of native parentage, 59.2 and 65.5, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 53.8 and 58.4, respectively; negroes, 58.1 for males and 60.9 for females.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married, for each sex, is higher in rural than in urban communities.

Dwellings and families.—The total number of dwellings in Arkansas is 327,625, and the total number of families 333,368, indicating that in very few cases does more than one family occupy a dwelling. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 4.8, and the average number per family, 4.7.

PER CENT OF NEGROES IN TOTAL POPULATION OF ARKANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1910.

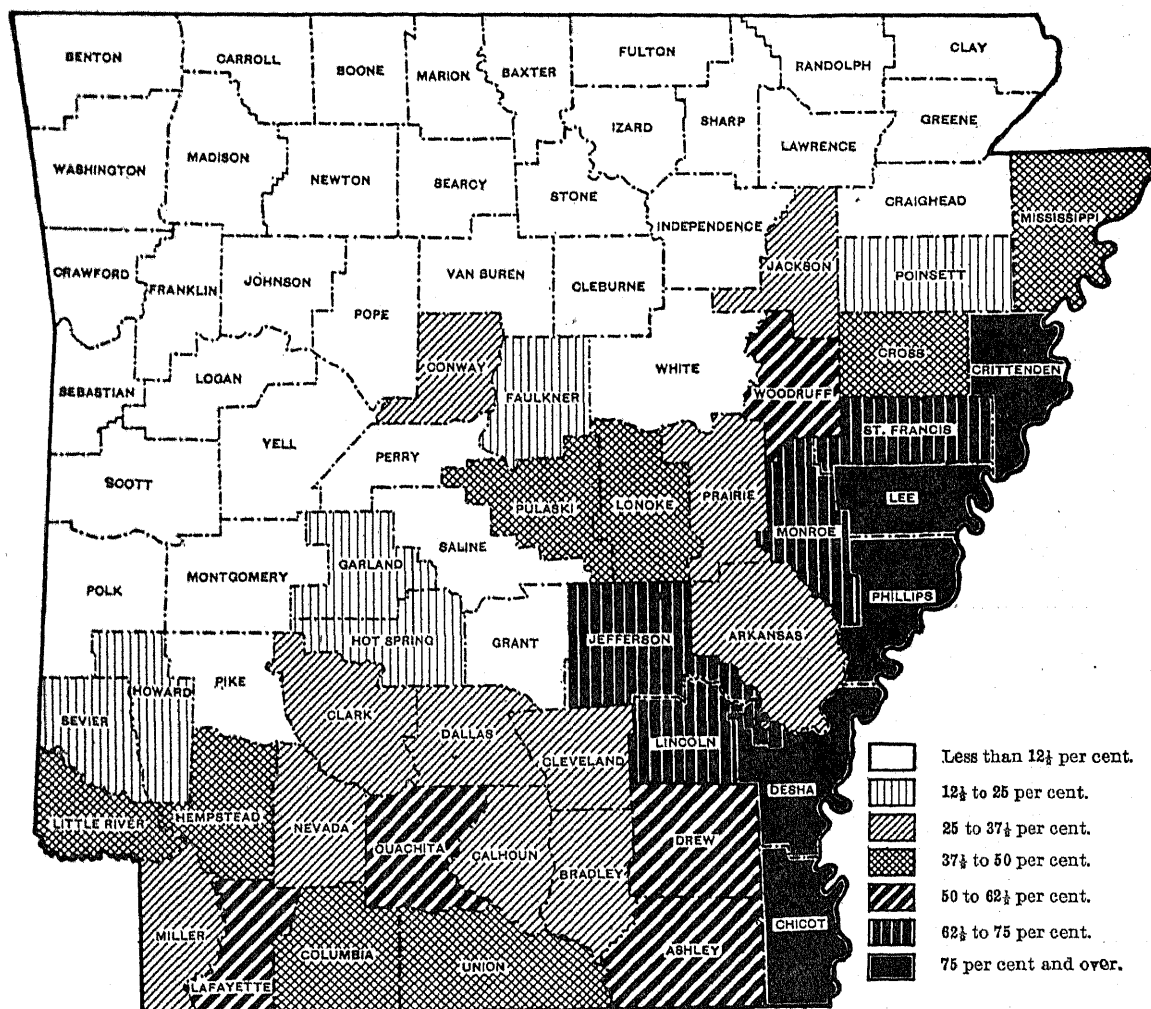
