Graphic Summary of the 1970 Population Census

This report presents 78 maps and charts excerpted from two 1970 Population Census final reports.

Figures 1 to 42 (shown on pages 5 to 36) are based on 100-percent data and are from report PC(1)-A1, **Number of Inhabitants**, "United States Summary." Figures 43 to 78 (shown on pages 343 to 358) are based on sample data and are from report PC(1)-C1, **General Social and Economic Characteristics**, "United States Summary." The statistics on which these maps and charts are based appear in the respective reports, which also contain definitions and technical explanations for the subjects covered here as well as general information on 1970 Census procedures.

A list of the figures in this report appears beginning on page 1. For a comparable graphic summary of data from the 1970 Housing Census, see Supplementary Report HC(S1)-16.



FIGURE 1 THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA




FIGURE 2 MAJOR ACQUISITIONS OF TERRITORY BY THE UNITED STATES AND DATE OF ADMISSION OF STATES

FIGURE 3 REGIONS AND GEOGRAPHIC DIVISIONS OF THE UNITED STATES



FIGURE 5 ECONOMIC SUBREGIONS AND STATE ECONOMIC AREAS: 1970



FIGURE 9 CENTER OF POPULATION FOR THE UNITED STATES: 1790 TO 1970




FIGURE 10 CENTER OF POPULATION FOR THE UNITED STATES: 1970, 1960, AND 1950




FIGURE 11 POPULATION DISTRIBUTION: 1970







FIGURE 13 CHANGES IN CONGRESSIONAL REPRESENTATION BY STATES: 1960 TO 1970




POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES: 1790-1970




POPULATION OF REGIONS: 1790 - 1970




FIGURE 19 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN TOTAL POPULATION BY STATES: 1960 TO 1970




FIGURE 20 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN TOTAL POPULATION BY STATES: 1950 TO 1960




FIGURE 21 STATES RANKED BY TOTAL POPULATION: 1970




FIGURE 22 STATES RANKED BY AMOUNT OF POPULATION CHANGE: 1960-1970




FIGURE 23 STATES RANKED BY PERCENT OF POPULATION CHANGE: 1960-1970





FIGURE 24 STATES RANKED BY POPULATION DENSITY: 1970

FIGURE 25 DISTRIBUTION BY POPULATION SIZE: ■ 1970 and 1960




FIGURE 26 DISTRIBUTION BY PERCENT CHANGE IN POPULATION: 1960 - 1970





FIGURE 27 POPULATION DENSITY BY COUNTIES: 1970



FIGURE 28 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN TOTAL POPULATION BY COUNTIES: 1960 TO 1970



FIGURE 30 YEAR OF MAXIMUM POPULATION BY COUNTIES OF THE UNITED STATES




FIGURE 31 POPULATION BY SIZE OF PLACE: 1970






FIGURE 32 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN URBAN POPULATION BY STATES: 1960 TO 1970





FIGURE 36 PERCENT OF POPULATION URBAN BY STATES: 1970




FIGURE 37 PERCENT OF POPULATION URBAN BY COUNTIES: 1970




FIGURE 38 POPULATION INSIDE and OUTSIDE SMSA'S: 1970 and 1960

FIGURE 39 PERCENT OF POPULATION IN STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS BY STATES: 1970




FIGURE 40 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN METROPOLITAN POPULATION BY STATES: 1960 TO 1970




FIGURE 41 PERCENT OF CHANGE IN NONMETROPOLITAN POPULATION BY STATES: 1960 TO 1970




FIGURE 42 STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS OF 1 MILLION PERSONS OR MORE Ranked By Size: 1970




FIGURE 43 NATIVITY AND PARENTAGE OF THE WHITE POPULATION: 1900, 1920, 1940, 1960, 1970




FIGURE 44 COUNTRY OF ORIGIN OF THE FOREIGN STOCK: 1970




FIGURE 45 MOTHER TONGUE BY NATIVITY: 1970

 EACH SYMBOL=5 PERCENT






FIGURE 47 **NATIVE POPULATION BORN IN STATE OTHER THAN STATE OF RESIDENCE: 1900-1970**

EACH SYMBOL=2 PERCENT




FIGURE 48 **RESIDENCE IN 1965 FOR PERSONS 5 YEARS OLD AND OVER, Urban and Rural: 1970**




FIGURE 49 **RESIDENCE IN 1965 FOR PERSONS 5 YEARS OLD AND OVER**



FIGURE 51 By Age: 1940-1970




FIGURE 52 By Age and Race: 1970




FIGURE 53 FERTILITY RATIO: 1890-1970




FIGURE 54 POPULATION REPLACEMENT INDEX: 1970




FIGURE 55 PERCENT ENROLLED IN SCHOOL

By Regions and Divisions: 1970




FIGURE 57 MEDIAN YEARS OF SCHOOL COMPLETED








FIGURE 60 PERSONS 14 YEARS OLD AND OVER IN THE LABOR FORCE By Sex: 1940-1970




FIGURE 61 WEEKS WORKED IN PREVIOUS YEAR For Workers 14 Years Old and Over: 1950-1970




FIGURE 62 PERCENT OF PERSONS 14 YEARS OLD AND OVER IN LABOR FORCE By Age and Sex: 1950 1960 1970




FIGURE 63 PERCENT OF PERSONS 16 YEARS OLD AND OVER IN THE LABOR FORCE, By States: 1970




FIGURE 64 PERCENT OF WOMEN 16 YEARS OLD AND OVER IN THE LABOR FORCE: 1970




FIGURE 65 PERCENT UNEMPLOYED: 1970








FIGURE 66 MAJOR OCCUPATION OF EMPLOYED PERSONS By Race and Sex: 1970 and 1960




FIGURE 68 PERCENT OF EMPLOYED PERSONS BY SELECTED INDUSTRIES, By States: 1970

By Sex, for Employed Persons: 1940-1970




FIGURE 70 PERCENT OF WORKERS WORKING OUTSIDE COUNTY OF RESIDENCE
By Size of Place: 1970




FIGURE 71 PERCENT OF WORKERS USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
By Size of Place: 1970



 and Over




FIGURE 73 **NET PERCENT INCREASE, 1959-1969,

 By Race of Head, By Regions: 1960-1970**












FIGURE 78 RATIO OF INCOME IN 1969 TO POVERTY LEVEL
