## 1949 PUERTO RICO CENSUS OF MANUFACTURES

### ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The 1949 Puerto Rico Census of Manufactures was undertaken with funds provided by the Government of Puerto Rico and was conducted by the Bureau of the Census in close cooperation with that Government. Primary responsibility for the census was centered in the Industry Division of the Bureau of the Census. The Field Division of the Bureau also had important functions during particular phases of the Census. Furthermore, several officials of the Government of Puerto Rico played major roles in the planning and carrying out of its operations.

Among the many officials of Puerto Rico actively involved in this census, special mention must be made of the following: Juan Labadie-Eurite, Chief, Division of Statistics, Office of the Governor, Bureau of the Budget, who supervised all arrangements in connection with this census for the Government of Puerto Rico and acted in a liaison capacity in obtaining needed information from other Puerto Rican government agencies and some of the larger companies on the Island; Felix Mejias who, in his capacity as Census Bureau agent in Puerto Rico, assisted in the preliminary planning work in Washington and recruited the special staff required for processing the manufacturer's reports in the San Juan Field Office; Wilfredo de Santiago who supervised the field office staff in the mailing, follow-up and check-in of manufacturers' reports, as well as the editing and coding operations performed in the field office.


In addition to the Industry Division staff members mentioned previously, special recognition should be given to the contribution of Julius Shiskin, formerly Chief of the Industrial Census staff, who was responsible for much of the preliminary planning work, and Arthur W. Horowitz who, as a member of the Economic Planning and Analysis Section staff, assisted in the preparation of the census report forms, instructions, editing and coding procedures, development of table plans, disclosure analysis procedures, final table review, and was responsible for the recoding and retabulation of the 1939 Census data.

In the Field Division of the Bureau, Arthur L. Cook supervised all field activities, including the establishment of field offices and development of procedures for the check-in and follow-up of census reports. In the Office of the Coordinator of International Statistics, Iris C. Chapel translated the general explanations text into Spanish.
