

Key to Published and Tabulated Data for Small Areas

INTRODUCTION

GENERAL

The Key to Published and Tabulated Data for Small Areas has been designed as a guide to the large volume of information based on the Decennial Censuses of Population and Housing taken as of April 1, 1950. For particular types of localities and for specific subjects, the Key presents in tabular form both the amount of detail tabulated and the published portion thereof. In this manner, the large store of tabulated but unpublished data is identified simultaneously with the published material.

Among the types of areas referred to here as "small areas" are:

- Standard metropolitan areas
- Urbanized areas
- Urban places of 10,000 or more
- Urban places of 2,500 to 10,000
- Counties
- Places of 1,000 to 2,500
- Rural-nonfarm portions of counties
- Rural-farm portions of counties
- Minor civil divisions
- Census tracts
- Wards in untraced cities of 50,000 or more
- Blocks in cities of 50,000 or more

Later phases of the tabulation and publication programs of the 1950 Censuses of Population and Housing, not covered in this Key, will provide additional information for the larger areas, such as large cities, standard metropolitan areas, States, divisions, regions, and the United States as a whole.

DEFINITIONS OF SELECTED CENSUS TERMS

It is not intended to define here all of the census terms. These will be defined in the texts of the Census volumes and in the preprints of chapters of those volumes. However, two new types of statistical areas have been developed, and there has been a major change in the concept of urban-rural residence, the definitions of which are important even to those familiar with previous Census practices.

Standard metropolitan areas.--Each standard metropolitan area contains at least one city of 50,000 or more. In general, each comprises an entire county or group of two or more contiguous

counties that are economically and socially integrated. The outlying counties must meet several qualifications regarding population density and the volume of nonagricultural employment. In New England, standard metropolitan areas comprise groups of contiguous cities and towns, rather than entire counties. (See Appendix I for listing.)

Urbanized areas.--An urbanized area consists of a city of 50,000 or more and its urban fringe, though some urbanized areas contain two or more neighboring cities of 50,000 or more. An urbanized area is usually smaller than the corresponding standard metropolitan area, because its boundaries are not required to be extended to county lines. The following types of areas are included in the urban fringe of an urbanized area if they are contiguous to the central city or if they are contiguous to an area already included in the urbanized area.

1. Incorporated places with 2,500 inhabitants or more in 1940 or at a subsequent special census conducted prior to 1950.
2. Incorporated places with fewer than 2,500 inhabitants containing an area with a concentration of 100 dwelling units or more with a density in this concentration of 500 units or more per square mile. This density represents approximately 2,000 persons per square mile and normally is the minimum found associated with a closely spaced street pattern.
3. Unincorporated territory with at least 500 dwelling units per square mile.
4. Territory devoted to commercial, industrial, transportation, recreational, and other purposes functionally related to the central city.

Outlying noncontiguous areas with the required dwelling unit density located within $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the main contiguous urbanized part, measured along the shortest connecting highway, and other outlying areas within one-half mile of such noncontiguous areas which meet the minimum residential density rule also are included. (See Appendix II for listing.)

Urban-rural residence.--According to the definition adopted for the 1950 Census, the urban population comprises all persons living in:

1. Places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, boroughs, towns, and villages (except towns in New England, New York,

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and Wisconsin, where "towns" are minor civil divisions of counties and are not necessarily densely settled centers like the towns in the other States);

2. The densely settled urban fringe, including both incorporated and unincorporated areas, around cities of 50,000 or more; and

3. Unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside of any urban fringe.

The remaining population is classified as rural.

According to the urban definition used in previous censuses, the urban population comprised all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more and in areas (usually minor civil divisions) classified as urban under special rules relating to population size and density.

ENUMERATION DISTRICTS AND BLOCKS

The geographic unit of enumeration in the Census of Population is the enumeration district. These districts are the territories laid out as work assignments for the enumerators. They are so designed that the total for one enumeration district, or the summary for a combination of enumeration districts, provides statistics for each political or statistical type of area. In total, there were approximately 225,000 enumeration districts in 1950. These enumeration districts represent the smallest geographic areas which can be recognized in the punch cards for persons.

The same basic unit also applies to the Census of Housing. However, in selected cities (generally those of 50,000 inhabitants or more according to the 1940 Census--see Appendix IV for listing) the territory was further identified by block within enumeration district. These enumeration districts and blocks represent the smallest geographic areas which can be recognized in the punch cards for dwelling units.

TABULATION AREAS

The tabulation area is based on the geographic unit observed in a tabulation or a count of punch cards. The earlier counts are made on the basis of enumeration district or block. Later counts are based on larger areas. All of the population and housing data for small areas are tabulated in five counts of the respective cards. There are four types of tabulation areas identified by code letters in this Key:

Tabulation area A is the enumeration district. Statistics tabulated by enumeration districts can be consolidated to produce summaries for progressively larger areas.

Tabulation area B is the block. The characteristics so tabulated can be summarized for wards, tracts, and city totals.

Tabulation area C is the census tract. Figures by census tracts can be consolidated to furnish totals for tracted cities and their adjacent tracted areas, if any.

Tabulation area D comprises the following:

1. Each urban place of 2,500 inhabitants or more.
2. Each urban fringe (exclusive of urban places of 2,500 or more).
3. The rural-nonfarm portion of a county.
4. The rural-farm portion of a county.

Statistics tabulated according to tabulation area D can be consolidated to produce county (and State) totals. Some counts are identified as "Tabulation areas C and D." In such cases, census tracts within the tracted portion of each of the four parts listed above become separate categories.

Tabulation area D and tabulation areas C and D combined are further divided by tabulating separately those component parts classified as urban or rural in 1950 that would have been classified otherwise under the 1940 urban definition. In addition, the rural portion of a county in New England is separately tabulated into the part inside and the part outside a standard metropolitan area. (In New England standard metropolitan areas comprise groups of towns rather than complete counties.) By these means, the figures can be assembled in varying combinations to provide data for a given county by total, urban, rural farm, rural nonfarm, urban places, portion of county within a standard metropolitan area and within an urbanized area, census tracts, and the areas of the county that would be classified as urban or rural under the 1940 urban definition.

For the States of Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas, some of the data are separately tabulated for white persons of Spanish surname and for dwelling units in which the head of the household is such a person. The second count of the population cards and the third, fourth, and fifth counts of the housing cards are processed in this manner. The extent of publication of this information is indicated in the appropriate key tables.

PUBLICATION AREAS

The tabulations make possible the summarization of figures for a variety of political and other statistical areas. Not all of the information which is tabulated will be published. Each key

table indicates the tabulation area and thereby identifies the smallest geographic units used from which figures can be combined for larger geographic areas. In addition, the areas for which information is to be published are specifically listed in each key table, and exceptions thereto are noted.

In general, identical information is published for counties, standard metropolitan areas, urbanized areas, and urban places of 10,000 population or more. For these areas nearly all of the tabulated data are published. Some items are less detailed and others are omitted in the publication of information for rural-nonfarm and rural-farm portions of the county, urban places of 2,500 to 10,000, and census tracts.

Separate data for nonwhites are usually published only for areas in the South and for selected census tracts in those tracted areas having 10,000 or more nonwhites. The information presented is often less detailed than that given for the comparable total area. The South as a census region includes the States of Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.

In all housing tables, data for the constituent counties within a standard metropolitan area are published in the same detail as for the standard metropolitan area. Less detailed data are shown for other counties.

PUBLISHED REPORTS

The term "published" as used in this Key is to be understood as meaning either "now available in printed form" or "to be published." The final data for small areas will appear in the following Census volumes and reports:

Population--Volume I. This volume will contain the official population count for counties, minor civil divisions, incorporated places, unincorporated places of 1,000 or more, and wards of incorporated places of 5,000 or more. The data are arranged by States.

Population--Volume II, Chapter A. For each State, this chapter of Volume II repeats the information presented in Volume I.

Population--Volume II, Chapter B. For each State, this chapter will contain the data on the general characteristics of the population for small areas. (Chapter C of this volume will present detailed characteristics for the larger areas, i.e., the State as a whole; the urban, rural-nonfarm, and rural-farm parts of the State;

the larger cities and standard metropolitan areas).

Census Tract bulletins. These bulletins will present both population and housing data for tracted areas by census tracts. (See appendix III for listing).

Housing--Volume I. This volume will contain statistics on the general characteristics of housing.

Block Statistics bulletins. These bulletins will present housing characteristics by blocks for selected cities.

Spanish Surname report. This special report will provide population data on persons of Spanish-American ancestry in the five southwestern States--Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas.

The separate State chapters of Population Volumes I and II and Housing Volume I will be issued as paper-covered preprints in advance of the final compilation of the bound volumes. The data for each tracted area and for each of the block cities will be issued in bulletin form.

UNPUBLISHED DATA

Not all of the tabulated data will be published. For certain smaller types of areas and groups the detailed figures which are tabulated are consolidated into broader categories, or omitted, in publication. Thus, some detailed data for these areas and groups remain unpublished. Data which are tabulated but not published are so indicated in this Key (see section on "How to use this key").

A variation not specifically noted in the key tables arises through the use of new electronic tabulating equipment for the tabulation of the second to fifth counts of population data for areas in Alabama, Connecticut, Iowa, Louisiana, and Virginia. The use of this equipment will not affect data scheduled for publication, but, for these areas, will result in the loss of some of the data indicated as tabulated but unpublished.

Tabulated but unpublished data are available at the cost of compilation or reproduction within certain limitations. In requesting unpublished data, you should refer to the reports containing the published data on the same subject. If the subject and the classification as shown in this Key fit your needs for unpublished data, address a request for a cost estimate to the Director, Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D. C. Include in your request the specific nature of the unpublished statistics desired, a reference to this Key by

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title, the key table numbers showing the desired subject, and the specific area or areas for which the information is needed.

Preparation of the data requested cannot be undertaken until payment, in accordance with the cost estimate, has been received and cleared.

CHANGES IN TABULATION AND PUBLICATION PROGRAMS

Changes in the programs may be required after printing of this Key, because of changing costs and the impact of the defense program. In particular, it is possible that the Census Tract bulletins may not be published. If so, all the census tract data listed in the Key will be available in tabulated but unpublished form. Other changes will probably be of a minor nature.

HOW TO USE THIS KEY

The tabular presentation of subjects in this Key differs from the form in which the same subjects are published. The Key indicates both published and unpublished data, and data on the same subject have been grouped together here, although they may be published in several different tables or reports.

The following rules have been followed in the design of the key tables:

1. Every item shown is tabulated, or is obtainable by addition (or subtraction) of tabulated data, or is a calculated figure derived from the tabulated data.
2. Unpublished data are indicated by underlining the designation in the stub or the column heading.
3. Total columns are shown only when the total for a class is published or is directly available from the tabulation sheets.

4. Every deviation from the foregoing three rules is specifically noted.

Note: Calculated figures such as percentages, means, and medians are not readily available for areas other than those for which they are published.

In using this Key one may most easily locate the tables pertaining to specific subjects in the appropriate "List of key tables." Reference to the key table itself will provide one with the full scope of tabulation (see section on "Tabulation areas"), the detail of publication, and the nature of the unpublished data available. As an aid to finding specific subjects in the published reports, the appropriate "Index to published tables" cross-references the key table number and the report table numbers.

By way of illustrating the use of the key tables, a part of table P-9 is shown below:

All of the items shown are tabulated. Although not directly tabulated, age groupings by sex for the farm population are available by subtraction. As the underlined columns indicate, the data on nonfarm population both for males and females will not be published from this source. In addition, the data for total male and total female which will be published will exclude the items "15 to 20 years" and "21 to 24 years."
