THIRTEENTH CENSUS PUBLICATIONS.

The results of the Thirteenth Decennial Census will be published in two forms: A comprehensive report in 12 volumes, and a condensed report, the Abstract of the Thirteenth Census, which is being issued with Supplements for the different states.

The material contained in the Supplements embraces for each state all of the census results published concerning the state, its counties, cities, and other civil divisions, except as to occupations. This material is bound up in one volume with the Abstract of the Thirteenth Decennial Census. The result is a series of editions of the Abstract each with a different State Supplement, with the purpose of furnishing those who receive the Abstract with the statistics of the state in which they reside.

The material contained in the various State Supplements will also be printed by subjects in the final reports. The chapters relating to Population for all of the states will be assembled in two volumes of the final report on Population; those relating to Agriculture, in two volumes of the final report on that subject; those relating to Manufactures, in one volume of the final report on Manufactures; and those relating to Mining, in the final report on Mining.

The present pamphlet is a reprint of the State Supplement. It contains no material which is not available in the bound volume of the Abstract for the state to which it refers, or in the complete final report of the Thirteenth Census, and has been issued in a very limited edition for special purposes.

CHAPTER I.

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

Introduction.—This chapter gives the population of Ohio, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 574) shows the population of Ohio, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

It may be noticed that the county totals as given in Table 1 for 1900 and 1890 sometimes exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table. This is due in part to the fact that some of the minor civil divisions of certain counties had gone out of existence by 1910, their territory having been annexed to other divisions or taken to form new divisions. In other cases certain cities and villages returned as secondary divisions in 1910 and 1900 were returned independently in 1890.

Table 2 (p. 593) shows the cities and incorporated villages in Ohio, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Ohio, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the

increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

Density of population.—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

Minor civil divisions.—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, towns, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

Urban and rural population defined.—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory

HISTORICAL NOTE.—Ohio takes its name from the river which borders it on the south and southeast. The name of the river is a contraction of the Iroquois *Ohionhió*, "beautiful river."

The territory which now forms the state of Ohio was first explored by La Salle, a Frenchman. There are evidences that he discovered the Ohio River about 1670 and followed its course to the Louisville Rapids, but his first well-authenticated exploration was in August, 1679, when he sailed along the south shore of Lake Erie on his expedition to the Mississippi Valley. The French held possession of the territory as a trading ground until 1763, when, at the close of the French and Indian War, the French claims were relinquished in favor of the English. In 1778 the country west of the Ohio and east of the Mississippi was taken from the British by George Rogers Clark at the head of Virginia troops, and in the same year it was organized as a county of Virginia. At the close of the Revolution this territory was ceded to the United States by the British, and during the period 1781 to 1786 Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, and Virginia ceded to the Federal Government their claims to these lands, based on their early charters. Connecticut, however, did not cede all her western lands but kept over 3,500,000 acres—the Western Reserve—in what is now northeastern Ohio, and Virginia retained rights of soil in a tract in the southwestern part of the state to be used as legal bounties for Virginia

continental troops. In 1800 Connecticut transferred to the United States the jurisdiction over the Western Reserve.

The establishment, in 1787, of a territorial government for the region between the Ohio and the Mississippi, then known as the Northwest Territory, was followed by a large influx of pioneers from the older parts of the country. The first permanent settlement was made at Marietta in 1788 by a colony from Massachusetts. Later in the same year Losantiville, now Cincinnati, was founded by a party from Lexington, Ky.

In 1800 the greater part of the Northwest Territory—the area now comprising Indiana, excepting a narrow strip along the eastern boundary, Illinois, Wisconsin, western Michigan, and northeastern Minnesota—was organized as the territory of Indiana.

In November, 1802, a convention, authorized by Congress in April of the same year, met at Chillicothe and adopted a constitution for the state of Ohio; and on February 19, 1803, Congress declared the new state to be a member of the Union.

By the enabling act of 1802 the limits of Ohio were fixed as they now stand, with the exception of the northern boundary west of Lake Erie, which was established at its present location in 1836.

according to the conditions as they existed at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis,

and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—The population of Ohio is 4,767,121. Compared with a population of 4,157,545 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 609,576, or 14.7 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The population of the state has grown at

about the same rate during each of the last three decades. The following table shows the population of Ohio at each census from 1800 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Ohio was admitted as a state in 1803. The population of the territory now constituting the state was first enumerated at the Federal census of 1800. It will be observed from the above table that the early censuses show a very rapid rate of growth in the state. During the 20 years from 1800 to 1820 the population increased more than twelve times, and during the next 20 years, from 1820 to 1840, it considerably more than doubled. Since 1840 the growth of the state has been very much slower, the population not doubling again until 40 years later, in 1880. During the 30 years since 1880 the population of the state has increased 49.1 per cent.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States, as given in the preceding table, shows that during the first 40 years the population of the state increased very much faster than did that of the United States. Since 1840, however, the rate of increase for the state during each decade has been lower than that of the United States.

Principal cities.—Ohio has 82 cities. Cleveland, the largest, has a population of 560,663, and Cincinnati, the next largest city, a population of 363,591.

Columbus, Toledo, and Dayton, with 181,511, 168,497, and 116,577 inhabitants, respectively, are the only other cities with more than 100,000 population. Of the remaining cities, 3 have from 50,000 to 100,000, 6 from 25,000 to 50,000, 23 from 10,000 to 25,000, and 45 from 5,000 to 10,000 inhabitants, respectively. The aggregate population of the 82 cities is 2,467,054, or 51.8 per cent of the total population of the state.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the state with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table on page 569 shows the population of the 14 cities of Ohio having in 1910 over 25,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their incorporation as cities, towns, or villages, so far as figures are available, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Lorain shows the highest percentage of increase during the last decade, namely, 80.2 per cent, and Cincinnati the lowest, 11.6 per cent. Akron, Canton, Lorain, and Youngstown show increases during the last decade of over 50 per cent. Dayton, Lorain, and Toledo show lower rates of increase during the last decade, 1900-1910, than during the preceding decade, 1890-1900.

Cleveland has grown rapidly, though at widely varying rates, since 1830. From 1830 to 1870 the rates of increase in the population of the city ranged from 113.8 per cent for the decade 1860-1870 to 464.2 per cent for the decade 1830-1840. Since 1870 the rates of increase have ranged from 46.1 per cent for the decade 1890-1900 to 72.5 per cent for the decade 1870-1880. The absolute increase in population, however, has been larger with each succeeding decade since 1830.

The growth of Cincinnati during the last decade has been slow, the relative increase in population being the smallest shown for any decade covered by the table except that from 1890 to 1900, and the absolute

increase being smaller than for any decade since 1840 except that from 1890 to 1900.

Counties.—Ohio has 88 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 13,096 in Vinton County to 637,425 in Cuyahoga County.

There have been no changes in the territorial boundaries of the counties since 1900.

Forty-nine counties have increased in population during the last decade, the rates of increase ranging from one-tenth of 1 per cent in Fayette County to 65.6 per cent in Mahoning County, and the absolute increases from 19 in Fayette County to 198,305 in Cuyahoga County. Eighteen counties show a larger rate of increase than is shown for the state as a

whole, which, as before stated, was 14.7 per cent. Thirty-nine counties have decreased in population during the last decade, the rates of decrease ranging from one-tenth of 1 per cent in Lawrence County to 17.4 per cent in Paulding County, and the absolute decreases from 46 in Lawrence County to 5,225 in Wood County. The aggregate increase of population from 1900 to 1910 in the 49 counties that show an increase is 677,170; the aggregate decrease of population in the 39 counties that show a decrease is 67,594. The difference, 609,576, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

The maps on page 572 show the increase or decrease in the total and the rural population, respectively, of each county of Ohio during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 40,740 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 117; in 1900 and 1890 it was 102.1 and 90.1, respectively. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9. In density of population Ohio ranks eighth among the states.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 573, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Ashtabula County, with 723 square miles, has the largest area, and Lake County, with 241 square miles, has the smallest area. Cuyahoga County, containing Cleveland city, has the highest density of any county, namely, 1,376.7 persons per square mile, while Vinton County has the lowest density, namely, 31.8.

Minor civil divisions.—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Ohio the counties are divided into 1,389 primary divisions, comprising 1,379 townships, 8 cities, and 2 villages. There are also 773 secondary divisions, comprising 74 cities and 699 incorporated villages. Of these, 13 cities and 13 villages

are coextensive with the townships in which they are located, while 2 cities include within their limits the whole of one township, in addition to parts of others. A state law passed in 1902 provided that all municipalities having less than 5,000 inhabitants should be called villages and those having over 5,000 inhabitants, cities. Changes were to be made according to the results of the Federal census. As a result of this law some communities returned as cities in 1900 were returned as villages in 1910, while other communities returned as villages in 1900 were returned as cities in 1910.

Urban and rural population compared.—The following table presents the population of Ohio at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among cities and villages grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census. For the purposes of this table Union City village is included in the group of urban places having from 2,500 to 5,000 inhabitants, although it had a population of only 1,595 in 1910, 1,282 in 1900, and 1,293 in 1890. This is due to the fact that Union City village, Ohio, and Union City, Ind., each separately incorporated, are together commonly known as Union City, which had a joint population of 4,804 in 1910, 3,998 in 1900, and 3,974 in 1890.

As shown by the following table, the urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, the cities and incorporated villages of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 2,665,143 inhabitants, or 55.9 per cent of the total population, while 2,101,978 inhabitants, or 44.1 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, the cities and incorporated villages then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 1,998,382 inhabitants, or 48.1 per cent of the total population, while 2,159,163 inhabitants, or 51.9 per cent, lived in rural territory. There has thus been a considerable increase in the proportion of urban population. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

The proportion of the total population in the group of places from 100,000 to 500,000 inhabitants increased from 15.2 per cent in 1890 to 23.2 per cent in 1900, there being two cities in the group in 1890 and four in 1900. At some time between 1900 and 1910 Cleveland reached the 500,000 population mark and so passed out of the group. This loss was partly made up by the addition to the group of Dayton, which reached the 100,000 mark at some time during the decade. As a result of these two changes the proportion of the population in this group in 1910 fell to 17.4 per cent. The proportion of population in the group of places having from 50,000 to 100,000 inhabitants was considerably lower in 1900 than in 1890 or in 1910, owing to the fact that in 1900 only one city came within this class. No noteworthy change in the proportion of the total population in any of the groups of smaller cities and villages has occurred within the period covered by the table. The proportion of population in the combined groups of urban places having less than 100,000 inhabitants at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, was 26.7, 24.9, and 25.8 per cent, respectively.

The urban population of the state is contained in 82 cities and 57 villages, while that classed as rural is in 644 incorporated villages of less than 2,500 inhabitants each and in unincorporated territory. The 644 villages of less than 2,500 inhabitants each have an aggregate population of 452,030, representing 9.5 per cent of the total population of the state. These villages comprise 146 having from 1,000 to 2,500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 223,400; 191 having from 500 to 1,000 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 135,745; and 307 having less than 500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 92,885. The inhabitants of unincorporated territory number 1,649,948, or 34.6 per cent of the total population.

The table on page 570 shows further that in all incorporated places, including those of less than 2,500 inhabitants, there was in 1910 a population of 3,117,173, or 65.4 per cent of the population of the state. The population of all incorporated places, as they existed in 1900, was 2,416,099, or 58.1 per cent of the population of the state.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that 61 counties had a larger proportion and 6 counties a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900. Four counties had urban population in 1910 that had only rural in 1900. Three counties had the same proportion of urban population and 14 counties were wholly rural at both censuses. In each of 17 counties more than 50 per cent of the population was urban in 1910.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggre-

gate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the table below, the total population in 1910 of those cities and villages which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 2,665,143; in 1900 the total population of these same places (so far as separately reported) was 2,027,462. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of those cities and villages which at that time had not less than 2,500 inhabitants each, 1,998,382 (see table on p. 570), by 29,080. The difference is the net result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class and vice versa and of annexations of territory during the same period.

A comparison of the total population in 1910 of the cities and villages having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the table below, shows an increase of 31.5 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the state, decreased 1.3 per cent. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.9 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent. As shown by Table I of Chapter 2 there are 62 counties in Ohio in which rural population decreased but only 8 in which there was a decrease of urban population.

In the following table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the population of the city of Cleveland, the combined population of the other cities having, in 1910, 100,000 inhabitants or more, the combined population of cities having from 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants, and of cities and villages having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants, respectively, and the population of the remainder of the state.




From this table it appears that the city of Cleveland increased in population during the last decade nearly three times as fast, and the group of cities having from 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants each increased about three and one-half times as fast as the state as a whole, while the group of other cities in the state outside of Cleveland having over 100,000 inhabitants and the group of cities and villages having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants each increased somewhat less than twice as fast as the state as a whole. The population living in rural territory decreased 28,105, or 1.3 per cent.
