

PREFACE

This report presents statistics on selected population and housing characteristics of the white population of Spanish surname in the five Southwestern States in which this population is concentrated--Texas, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, and California. The data are based on tabulations from the 1950 Censuses of Population and Housing, conducted as of April 1, 1950. Provision for the Seventeenth Decennial Census was made in the act providing for the Fifteenth and subsequent decennial censuses, approved June 18, 1929; the 1950 Census of Housing was authorized by the Housing Act of 1949, approved July 15, 1949. The major portion of the information compiled from the Census of Population of 1950 appears in Volume I, Number of Inhabitants, and in Volume II, Characteristics of the Population. These two volumes contain statistics for regions, divisions, States, and parts of States, as well as for the country as a whole. The general data on the characteristics of dwelling units compiled from the 1950 Census of Housing appear in Volume I, General Characteristics.

This is one of a series of reports (Series P-E bulletins) which comprise Population, Volume IV, Special Reports, and supplement the information contained in Population, Volumes I and II, and Housing, Volume I. The present bulletin is a preprint of Chapter C of Part 3, National Origin and Race, of Volume IV.

The materials presented here were prepared under the supervision of Howard G. Brunsman, Chief, Population and Housing Division, Dr. Henry S.
