

PUBLISHED AND UNPUBLISHED DATA AVAILABLE FROM THE 1960 CENSUS OF POPULATION

PART 1. INTRODUCTION

The various 1960 population data which are being compiled, are described in outline form in this booklet. These data are available in one or more of three basic forms. First, the data may appear in printed form in formal Bureau of the Census publications. Second, some of the data are available in the form of copies of unpublished listings or reproduced statistical tables. Almost all of these listings and tables also are available in the form of microfilm reels. Third, they may be available on magnetic computer tape suitable for further summarization and processing on computers compatible with the Univac Scientific Computers of the Bureau of the Census.

Both complete-count and sample data for the 1960 Census of Population are available for a series of large and small areas that cover the entire United States. Most data tabulated for large areas are to be published. However, because of the large number of small areas, and the extent of tabulated data prepared for them, it is not feasible to publish all available data. Therefore, much of these data, particularly for the smaller areas, are available in unpublished form as reproduced statistical tables and microfilm copies of them, or in tabulated form on magnetic computer tape.

This booklet contains four outline tables which itemize the detail available for each subject, and for each level of geographic area, in any of the major forms described above. Part 2 describes the final publication program, along with expected publication dates. Part 3 outlines all of the various tabulated and unpublished data and materials available, as well as cost and dates of availability.

The publications described in this booklet are restricted to Population Volume 1, and the population statistics portion of the Census Tract Reports. Volume I consists of four series: PC(1)A, PC(1)B, PC(1)C, and PC(1)D. The Census Tract Reports are referred to as Series PHC(1), which contain housing data as well. All of the Final Reports are described in Part 2.

In order to simplify and standardize wherever possible, the outlines exclude all reference to historical data, and with some few exceptions, to derived figures as well. The outlines as presented are applicable to all States.

Where the outlines indicate specified data to be published for urban places, these data are shown for all urban places, incorporated and unincorporated, urban towns in New England, and urban townships in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. The data shown for urban places of 10,000 or more are also shown for non-urban

towns and townships of 10,000 or more in New England and New Jersey. Substantially the same data are published for the total of the United States in the U.S. Summaries of the reports, as are shown in this outline for the total of each State.

The interrelationship of the various sections of the four basic tables is described below.

I. COMPLETE-COUNT DATA

All of the complete-count data available in any form, are described in table 1. As the headnote indicates, counts of the number of inhabitants for the various areas are available in published form in Series PC(1)A, as described in Part 2. These counts are also available in unpublished form for each of about 270,000 enumeration districts. Enumeration districts are the small areas, with an average population of 700, into which the entire United States was divided for purposes of enumeration. Unpublished counts of the number of inhabitants for enumeration districts are described in item 1 of Part 3.

Table 1, column 1

Complete-count population characteristics, as itemized in table 1, column 1, were tabulated for each enumeration district. These enumeration district tabulations served as "building blocks," used for summarization to larger areas. Tabulations for these basic "building blocks" are available in the form of magnetic computer tape. This enumeration district file also contains housing data not described here. The tabulation is described in item 2 of Part 3.

These same "building blocks" on tape were then summarized in the subject detail and geographic areas shown, as follows:

Table 1, columns 2 through 5

Columns 2 through 5 of table 1 outline the larger area summarizations prepared for publication, for the various areas described in the column headings. This publication is described in Part 2 as Volume I, Series PC(1)B.

Table 1, column 6

Column 6 itemizes the summarization of complete-count data prepared for each Census Tract in tracted areas, for publication. There are approximately 23,000 Census Tracts, with relatively permanent boundaries, comprising the entire area within 135 of the standard metropolitan statistical areas, and parts of 45 additional areas. This is described in Part 2 as the Census Tract Reports, Series PHC(1).

Table 1, column 7

Column 7 itemizes the content of the unpublished statistical tables available for each enumeration district, each Census Tract in tracted areas, and for each minor civil division and similar small area outside tracted areas. The tracts in tracted areas are as described above for column 6. The 30,000 or so minor civil divisions and similar small areas outside tracted areas are defined as follows:

a. Wards in cities of 25,000 or more for which wards have been established.

b. Urban places of 2,500 to 25,000, and places of 25,000 or more for which wards have not been established. The separate parts of an urban place in two or more minor civil divisions will be shown separately.

c. The remainder of each census county division, township, town, or other minor civil division outside separate urban places.

These unpublished data are described in Part 3 as item 3.

The unpublished data described for Census Tracts in column 7 are quite similar to those designated for publication in column 6, but the unpublished table PH-1 is currently available on an advance basis, since these complete count data must necessarily await the tabulation of sample data before the Census Tract Reports can be published. Table PH-1 also includes housing data not described here.

II. SAMPLE DATA

Table 2 describes the sample data available for small areas, table 3 outlines sample inventory data for the larger areas, and table 4 describes the various cross-classifications of sample data for the larger areas.

Because of sampling variability, it is not feasible to obtain valid statistics on the census characteristics enumerated on a sample basis for areas as small as enumeration districts. Therefore, the tabulation of sample data for small areas observed the approximately 23,000 Census Tracts in tracted areas, and about 30,000 minor civil divisions and similar areas outside the tracted areas, as described for the complete count data.

Table 2, column 1

Column 1 of table 2 describes the detail of population data tabulated for each of these approximately 53,000 "building blocks." These are available in the form of magnetic computer tape. This is described as item 4 of Part 3.

Table 2, column 2

Column 2 describes the condensation made for Census Tracts for publication in the Census Tract Reports. This is described in Part 2 as Series PHG(1). This same column also shows the supplementary additional detail available for tracts in tracted areas, in unpublished form as Special Table PH-2. Special Table PH-2 is described in Part 3 as item 5.

Table 2, column 3

Column 3 presents the detail available for minor civil divisions and similar small areas outside tracted areas in the form of unpublished Special Tables PH-3 through PH-7. In effect, the sum total of the data contained in tables PH-3 through PH-7 is the equivalent of the sample data to be published in the Census Tract Reports, plus the content of unpublished Special Table PH-2. Special Tables PH-3 through PH-7 are described as item 6 of Part 3.

The tabulations for the basic "building block" described in column 1 includes housing data. Special Table PH-2 includes housing data, and Special Tables PH-8 through PH-11, not described here, contain only housing data.

Table 3

This table describes the inventory sample data to be published for the larger areas. The publication is described in Part 2 as Volume I, Series PC(1)C. Substantially all of the tabulated data will be published for the larger areas. However, this same large area subject detail will be available for the smaller areas on magnetic tape.

Consequently, as a by-product of this tabulation program, essentially the same detail for each subject which is to be published at the State level, as shown in column 1, is also available on magnetic computer tape for each urban place of 2,500 or more, the remainder of each urbanized area, and the rural farm and nonfarm parts of counties and standard metropolitan statistical areas. This tape file is described as item 7 of Part 3.

Table 4

This table outlines the various cross-classifications of sample data to be published for the larger areas. The publication is described in Part 2 as Volume I, Series PC(1)D. As in the case of table 3, substantially all of the tabulated data will be published for the larger areas. This same large area subject detail will be available on magnetic tape for the smaller areas.

Consequently, as a byproduct of this tabulation program, essentially the same detail for each subject which is to be published at the State, or other large area level, is also available on magnetic computer tape for the urban, rural nonfarm, and rural farm parts of each:

- City of 100,000 population or more
- Remainder of each county of 250,000 population or more (outside New England)
- Remainder of each standard metropolitan statistical area of 100,000 population or more (by State for standard metropolitan statistical areas in two or more States)
- Remainder of each State.

In addition, where table 4 specifies data for non-whites in selected areas based on a minimum number of

nonwhite persons, these nonwhite data will appear on the magnetic tape file without this size restriction.

This tape file is described as item 8 of Part 3.

III. MAPS

Copies of maps for the various areas are available in published or unpublished form, as follows:

a. Enumeration districts.--These maps will not be published. They are available in unpublished form as described in item 9 of Part 3.

b. Census tracts.--The final Census Tract Reports (Series PHC(1)) as published, will contain maps showing the boundaries of the Census Tracts. However, copies of preliminary drafts of maps may be obtained on an advance basis, as described in item 9 of Part 3.

c. Minor civil divisions.--The published Volume I, Series PC(1)A will contain maps of census county divisions where established, and minor civil divisions elsewhere.

d. Larger areas.--The various other published reports described in Part 2 will contain the maps relating to counties, urban places of 25,000 or more, and standard metropolitan statistical areas.

PART 2. PUBLISHED FINAL REPORTS FOR THE 1960 CENSUS OF POPULATION

Volume I. Characteristics of the Population. This volume will consist of separate reports for the United States, each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and Canal Zone. For each of these 57 areas, the data will first be issued in four separate, paper-bound, chapters, designated as A, B, C, and D. The four chapters for each area will then be assembled and issued in a buckram-bound "part." In addition, all of the 57 chapters A will be assembled and issued in a buckram-bound edition, designated as Part A. (For Guam, Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and Canal Zone, the material normally contained in chapters B, C, and D will be included in chapter B.)

Series PC(1)A. Number of Inhabitants. These reports contain final population counts for States and counties and their urban and rural parts, and for standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, all incorporated places, unincorporated places of 1,000 or more inhabitants, and minor civil divisions, as described in headnote of outline table 1. Reference is Series PC(1A) to 57A, to be issued September 1960 - May 1961. This is described in 1960 Census of Population Announcement No. 3P.

Series PC(1)B. General Population Characteristics. These reports present statistics on sex, age, marital status, color or race, and relationship to head of household for States and counties and their urban and rural parts, and for standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, places of 1,000 or more inhabitants, and minor civil divisions, as described in outline table 1, columns 2 through 6. Reference is Series PC(1)-1B to 57B, to be issued November 1960 - June 1961. This is described in 1960 Census of Population Announcement No. 4P.

Series PC(1)C. General Social and Economic Characteristics. These reports will cover the subjects of nativity and parentage, State of birth, country of origin of the foreign stock, mother tongue, place of residence in 1955, year moved into present house, school enrollment by level and type, years of school completed, families and their composition, fertility, veteran status, employment status, weeks worked in 1959, year last worked, occupation group, industry group, class of worker, place of work, means of transportation to work, and income of persons and families. Each subject will be shown for some or all of the following areas: States and counties and their urban, rural-nonfarm, and rural-farm parts, standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places, as described in outline table 3. Reference is Series PC(1)-1C to 53C, to be issued July 1961 - March 1962. This is described in 1960 Census of Population Announcement No. 6P.

Series PC(1)D. Detailed Characteristics. These reports will present most of the subjects covered in chapter C, above, cross-classified by age, color, and other characteristics. There will also be included additional information on families, as well as data on single years of age, detailed occupation, and detailed industry. Each subject will be shown for some or all of the following areas: States and their urban, rural-nonfarm, and rural-farm parts; and large counties, cities, and standard metropolitan statistical areas,

as described in outline table 4. Reference is Series PC(1)-1D to 53D, to be issued October 1961 - July 1962.

Volume II. Subject Reports. This volume will consist of approximately 40 reports devoted essentially to detailed cross-relationships for the United States and regions for such subjects as national origin and race, fertility, families, marital status, migration, education, employment, unemployment, occupation, industry, and income. On some subjects (e.g., migration) statistics will also be shown for standard metropolitan statistical areas or States. In addition, there will be reports on veterans, the U.S. population overseas, and the geographic distribution and characteristics of the institutional population. Reference is Series PC(2). To be issued in 1962.

Volume III. Selected Area Reports. This volume will consist of two reports showing selected characteristics of the population (1) for State economic areas, and (2) according to the size of place where the individual resided. Reference is Series PC(3)-1 and 2. To be issued in 1962.

Volume IV. Summary and Analytical Report. This report will present an analytical review of the results of the 1960 Population Census for each major subject field. To be issued in 1962.

Census Tract Reports. These reports will present information on both population and housing subjects. There will be one report for each of 180 tracted areas in the United States and Puerto Rico. The population subjects include age, race, marital status, country of origin of the foreign stock, relationship to head of household, school enrollment, years of school completed, place of residence in 1955, employment status, occupation group, industry group, place of work, means of transportation to work, and income of families, as well as certain characteristics of the nonwhite population in selected tracts.

The housing subjects include tenure, color of head of household, vacancy status, condition and plumbing facilities, number of rooms, number of bathrooms, number of housing units in structure, year structure built, basement, heating equipment, number of persons in unit, persons per room, year household head moved into unit, automobiles available, value of property, and gross and contract rent, as well as certain characteristics of housing units with nonwhite household head for selected tracts.

In addition, for selected tracts these reports will contain data on certain population and housing subjects for persons of Puerto Rican birth or parentage and for white persons with Spanish surnames. (This series is the same as the tract reports listed in the description of the publication program for the 1960 Census of Housing.) This is described in table 1, column 6, and in table 2, column 2. Reference is Series PHC(1)-1 to 180, to be issued July 1961 - January 1962.

PART 3. UNPUBLISHED DATA AND MATERIALS AVAILABLE FROM THE 1960 CENSUS OF POPULATION

Requests for any of the materials described below should be directed to Chief, Population Division, Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D.C. Where the exact price of an item can be determined from a quotation based on number of areas, or on total population, the data may be ordered directly on the basis of this information. Such requests should be accompanied by a check or money order made payable to "Census - Department of Commerce."

Where a specific cost is not quoted, or where there is insufficient information to compute an exact cost, a request for estimate of cost may be obtained from the Chief, Population Division. All requests for Housing data should be directed to Chief, Housing Division, at the same address.

It must be stressed that all unpublished data are unreviewed and unedited, and consequently may contain minor tabulation errors. It will be appreciated if all such errors are brought to our attention. Though every effort will be made to recognize these errors in our final published reports, we cannot provide any assurances that these advance or unpublished materials will be re-tabulated, re-microfilmed, etc.

Reproduced tables may be in the form of original tabulation sheets, or photocopies, or, Xerox copies of these sheets. Microfilm reels are 35mm, and the quoted prices relate to a positive copy. If the purchaser wishes to prepare his own Xerox prints, he will require a negative copy. The cost of this negative copy is twice the quoted price of the positive copy. The magnetic computer tape provided is compatible with the Univac Scientific, Model 1105 computers being used by the Bureau of the Census. Questions on compatibility with other computers, including those of other manufacturers, should be addressed to the local service bureau of the company in question.
