APPROXIMATE WEIGHT OF PETROLEUM AND PRODUCTS

[In the United States, petroleum and its products are measured by bulk, not weight. Quantities are customarily reduced to the equivalent of barrels of 42 U.S. gallons (158.984 liters). In many foreign countries these commodities are measured by weight. The specific gravity of the different grades of crude petroleum and of the finished products varies materially. On the basis of approximate averages, the Dept. of Commerce uses the following factors for converting foreign weight statistics to gallons or to barrels of 42 gallons]

APPENDIX III

Guide to Sources of Statistics

Alphabetically arranged by subject, this guide contains references to the important primary sources of statistical information for the United States. Secondary sources have been included if the information contained in them is presented in a particularly convenient form or if primary sources are not readily available. Nonrecurrent publications presenting compilations or estimates for years later than 1960 or types of data not available in regular series are also included.

Much valuable information may also be found in State reports (see pp. 961-964) and in reports for particular commodities, industries, or similar segments of our economic and social structure. Because of the large number of such references, they are not included here.

An asterisk (*) preceding the title of publications listed signifies that data from the publications appear in the *Statistical Abstract*. It should not be assumed that all of the subjects from the original sources are summarized in the *Abstract*.

Publications listed under each subject are divided into two main groups: "U.S. Government" and "Other." The location of the publisher of each report is given except for Federal agencies located in Washington, D.C. Mailing addresses of non-government agencies and of international organizations are given on pp. 968-970. Most Federal publications may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. In some cases, Federal publications may be obtained from the issuing agency.

Major reports, such as the *Census of Population*, which consist of many volumes, are listed by their general, all-inclusive titles. Specific volume numbers and subtitles of the major census publications are listed on pp. 955-960.
