


Low-income households suffer greater-than-average health risks in their homes.

DAILY TOBACCO SMOKE INSIDE THE HOME






HOUSEHOLD BELIEVES PRIMARY WATER SOURCE IS NOT SAFE TO DRINK





AIR IN HOME HAS BEEN TESTED FOR RADON






