<sup>1</sup> A margin of error (MOE) is a measure of an estimate's variability. The larger the MOE in relation to the size of the estimate, the less reliable the estimate. This number, when added to and subtracted from the estimate, forms the 90 percent confidence interval. MOEs shown in this table are based on standard errors calculated using replicate weights.

<sup>2</sup> In the CPS ASEC, individuals are considered to be uninsured if they do not have health insurance coverage for the entire calendar year. In the ACS, individuals are considered uninsured if they are uninsured at the time of interview.

<sup>3</sup> The estimates by type of coverage are not mutually exclusive; people can be covered by more than one type of health insurance during the year.

<sup>4</sup> Private health insurance includes coverage provided through an employer or union, coverage purchased directly, or TRICARE.

<sup>5</sup> Public health insurance coverage includes Medicaid, Medicare, CHAMPVA (Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs), and care provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs and the military.

<sup>6</sup> Includes CHAMPVA, as well as care provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs and the military.
