The key for REGION is as follows:

- 1 = Northeast
- 2 = Midwest
- 3 = South
- 4 = West

The key for DIVISION is as follows:

- 1 = New England

- 2 = Middle Atlantic
- 3 = East North Central
- 4 = West North Central
- 5 = South Atlantic
- 6 = East South Central
- 7 = West South Central
- 8 = Mountain
- 9 = Pacific

The key for SEX is as follows:

- 0 = Total
- 1 = Male
- 2 = Female

The key for ORIGIN is as follows:

- 0 = Total
- 1 = Not Hispanic
- 2 = Hispanic

The key for RACE is as follows:

- 1 = White Alone or in Combination
- 2 = Black or African American Alone or in Combination
- 3 = American Indian and Alaska Native Alone or in Combination
- 4 = Asian Alone or in Combination
- 5 = Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander Alone or in Combination

Note: Hispanic origin is considered an ethnicity, not a race. Hispanics may be of any race.

'In combination' means in combination with one or more other races. The sum of the five race groups adds to more than the total population because individuals may report more than one race.

The original race data from Census 2000 are modified to eliminate the "Some Other Race" category. This modification is used for all Census Bureau estimates products and is explained in the document entitled "Modified Race Data Summary File Technical Documentation and ASCII Layout" that can be found on the Census Bureau website at <http://www.census.gov/popest/archives/files/MRSF-01-US1.html>.

The April 1, 2000 population estimates base reflects changes to the Census 2000 population from the Count Question Resolution program and geographic program revisions.
