



QUARTERLY SUMMARY OF STATE AND LOCAL TAX REVENUE, JANUARY-MARCH 1963

State and local governments in the United States collected \$43.5 billion in taxes during the 12-month period ending with March 1963. State tax revenue amounted to \$21.7 billion, and local taxes were slightly more, \$21.8 billion. The distribution by type of tax was as follows:

State-local tax collections were 7.5 percent greater in the first quarter of 1963 than in the same period of 1962. The trend was particularly marked for State taxes, up altogether about \$400 million, or more than 9 percent from the beginning quarter of 1962. First-quarter local taxes showed an increase of about \$240 million, or 5.4 percent. However, this should not be taken to indicate that local tax collections for all of calendar 1963 are likely to lag so much behind the trend in State tax revenue, in view of the diversity of collection timing for various taxes. Additional background in this regard is available from a previous report.¹

That report included month-by-month nationwide totals of tax collections by level of government and by type of tax; property tax totals for each of the 123 most populous county-type areas, with a percentage distribution of such collection amounts by months; and quarterly statistics on the revenue of individual States from the 5 types of taxes which are similarly presented in table 3 of this report.

Table 1 shows nationwide tax revenue amounts for the first 3 months of 1963 and for earlier intervals since the beginning of calendar 1962. These figures reflect a continuance of the upward trend in State-local taxes that has been indicated by recent annual Census Bureau reports on governmental finances.² It should be noted, however, that the statistics in those publications pertain to fiscal years (i.e., for most States and school districts the 12 months ended June 30, but for other governmental units commonly the calendar year or some other interval). Accordingly, the nationwide amounts shown here in table 1 cannot be used in direct conjunction with fiscal year aggregates published for earlier periods to derive a consistent historical series of data.

Table 2 reports property tax collections of the most recent quarter and 12-month period for individual county areas that had at least 250,000 inhabitants in 1960. Table 3 shows the amounts collected by individual State governments from each of five major types of taxes. Additional background for the use and interpretation of these data appears in the report described in footnote 1.

CONCEPTS AND TERMINOLOGY

In this as well as other Census Bureau reports on governmental finances, the concept of "taxes" is intended to comprise all "compulsory contributions exacted by a government for public purposes, except employer and employee assessments for retirement and social insurance purposes, which are classed as insurance trust revenue." Outside the scope of this report, accordingly, are collections from the unemployment compensation "taxes" imposed by each of the State governments and the District of Columbia. Included, however, are all receipts from licenses and compulsory fees,

including those which are imposed for regulatory purposes as well as those designed to provide revenue.

Tax revenue is defined to include related penalty and interest receipts, but to exclude protested amounts and refunds. The deduction from gross collections of amounts refunded is particularly significant with respect to motor fuel sales taxes ("gasoline" taxes).

The general nature of the several major kinds of taxes shown separately in this report will be suggested by their headings; explicit definitions appear in the report cited in footnote 1. Of the State-local collections summarized here briefly under the residual heading "All other taxes," a major portion (56 percent in the fiscal year 1961) involves selective sales taxes, such as those on cigarettes, liquor, and public utilities, with the balance involving various kinds of imposts, including death and gift taxes, severance taxes, general corporation licenses, and miscellaneous other licenses.

SOURCES OF DATA, AND LIMITATIONS

The statistics in this report are based mainly upon three mail surveys, dealing respectively with State-administered taxes, locally collected property taxes, and certain locally collected nonproperty taxes. These surveys provided a basis for 96 percent of the collection amounts summarized in table 1. The remaining 4 percent (making up 8 percent of the local government total, and representing about one-sixth of sums shown for "All other

taxes" but only very small percentages of other tax classes) was imputed by reference to findings of recent annual Census Bureau surveys of local government finances.

Property tax amounts shown in table 1 are estimates based upon information about a stratified sample panel of 521 counties or county-type areas, which are served altogether by nearly 6,300 local tax collecting agencies. Month-by-month collection figures were requested by mail from all these agencies, and reports were obtained from about 95 percent of them. Sampling variation was calculated for the property tax data thus developed from the initial sample survey, covering 1962. The sampling variation of the 12-month aggregate was determined to be less than 1 percent. That is, the chances are about 2 out of 3 that the estimated yearly total differs by less than 1 percent from the results that would have been obtained from a complete enumeration. The quarterly estimates were found subject to a sampling variability of 1 1/2 percent, and the single-month estimates generally showed sampling variability of about 2 to 4 percent.

A more detailed discussion of survey sources and methodology, and of data limitations, is to be found in the report cited in footnote 1.
