2. How to create a table [back to top](#)

To create a table, refer to the drop down menus on the left side of the RHFS Table Creator Main Page. Of note, are the following items:

Select Year:

- Use the drop down menu to select the survey year.
- The 2015 RHFS summary tables are undergoing revisions at this time and have been removed from table creator. An announcement will be placed on the website when the revised tables are uploaded to the website.
- The 2012 RHFS data are not available using table creator, but can be accessed by clicking <https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/rhfs/data/summary-tables.html>.

Select Estimate Type:

- Use the drop down menu to select properties or units as the estimate type.

Select Table:

- Use the drop down menu to select the desired table.
- The table options are:

Property Configuration

The table provides the following types of data: number of buildings on property, number of units on property, percentage of units on the property (efficiencies/studios, one bedroom, two bedroom, three or more bedrooms), percentage of units rented, etc.

Ownership and Management

The table provides the following types of data: state of property when acquired, year property acquired, year property rehabilitated, etc.

Income and Subsidies

The table provides the following types of data: residential rental receipts for property, monthly rental receipts per housing unit, percentage of tenants on property receiving section 8 vouchers, highest monthly rent, etc.

Expenses

The table provides the following types of data: total operational expenses per housing unit, property maintenance cost per housing unit, electric/gas cost per housing unit, property purchase price, number of debts, etc.

Finance and Mortgage

The table provides the following types of data: current market value of property, how market value for property was determined, etc.

Capital Improvements and Expenses

The table provides the following types of data: total value of capital improvement to property, total value of capital improvement per housing unit, etc.

Column Variables:

- Use the drop down menu to select the desired column variable that you wish to display for the selected table.
- Only one column variable can be selected at a time.
- If you do not select a column variable, “none” is the default. All units will display.

Filters:

- Use a filter to narrow the scope of a table.
- Property size is the only filter available for RHFS. Use the drop down menu to select from one of six options:

All (default)

1 unit

2 – 4 units

5 – 24 units

25 – 49 units

50+ units.

Reset

- Reset clears all work related to the current table and makes table creator ready to create a new table.

Apply

- Click **Apply** to create a table.
- Numbers are in thousands, except as indicated. Weighting is consistent with Census 2010.
- For instructions to download a table in an Excel or PDF format, refer to Item 3 below.

3. Downloading a table [back to top](#)

- You can download a table in PDF or Excel formats.
- After a table has been created, click  (download icon) located on the top-left tool bar.
- To download a table in a PDF format, click PDF.
- To download a table in an Excel format, click XLS.
- For the Excel download in some browsers, a box may popup asking you, “Do you want to open or save the table from census.gov?”
- Click “Open” or one of the “Save” options.
- In some browsers, you may get the following message: “The file format and extension of ‘table name.xls’ don’t match. The file could be corrupted or unsafe. Unless you trust its source, don’t open it. Do you want to open it anyway?” Click “Yes.”
- Enable editing if necessary and adjust the column lengths as needed.

4. Rounding and Formatting [back to top](#)

- A blank cell represents an estimate that was not calculated because of system limitations. (Ex. Mean/median estimates across column variables.)
- 'D' represents an estimate that is withheld to avoid disclosing data for an individual property or an estimate with an unacceptable level of statistical reliability.
- 'X' represents “not applicable” where there is a true zero value and the margin of error cannot be calculated.
- 'Z' represents an estimate that is less than 500 units or a percentage estimate less than 0.5%. It also represents a margin of error less than 50 units or a percentage margin of error less than 0.05%.

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- There will be a “0” in the cell if it is a true “0” (Ex. no properties met criteria).

6. Row and Column Variable Ranges [back to top](#)

- Variables ranges are pre-defined and cannot be customized. For example, in the “Property Configuration” table, the ranges for “Number of Buildings on Property” are “1 building,” “2 to 3 buildings,” “4 to 5 buildings,” “6 to 9 buildings,” etc. and cannot be changed.
- Ranges can only be manipulated using the RHFS Public Use Files.
